

ANOTHER PIONEER WOMAN PASSES AWAY.

Crossed the Plains when a Young Woman in 1852.

It is with much regret that we have to announce the death of Mrs. Mary E. Stillwell, wife of Captain W. D. Stillwell, a pioneer woman of Oregon who crossed the plains with ox team in 1852, which took place in this county on Monday.

Her maiden name was Mary E. Armentrout, being the daughter of Joseph Armentrout, and was born on the 22nd October, 1833, in Ohio. She moved to Keokuk, Iowa, and thence to Hancock county, Illinois.

But these things have all passed away, and we are sure that plenty and plenty permitted to enjoy the many blessings bestowed upon us, for which we are thankful.

by herself of some of her experience in the early days of this country:

One fine morning in the year 1852, in company with my sister and her husband, I started overland to Oregon, full of hopes for the future, little dreaming of the hardship and trials that were in store for me.

It was the 17th of April, a beautiful morning, when all nature seemed to spring into life and pour forth praise to the Giver of all Good, that we packed all our earthly possessions in one wagon, and that chiefly provisions and turned out faces toward the setting sun.

There was nothing of importance took place until the cholera broke out in the train. There was suffering then, I do not know how many were laid out by a grave and saw a mother lowered to her last resting place, the father and husband having been buried two days previous.

The journey came to an end as all things will on the 7th of September. We landed in Oregon to find that our hardships were not all ended. The country was new, every thing scarce and difficult to procure.

Some times in the absence of my husband I have stood in the door with my babe in my arms ready to fly at the approach of a savage.
