### PLAN AUTOMOBILE BOULE-VARD TO BEACHES.

From Portland, Through McMinnville, Sheridan and Dolph

The building of an automobile boulevard to Tillamook and the beach through Lafayette. McMinorilla fit through Lafayette, McMinnville, Sher idan, Wilhelmina, Grand Ronde, Dolph and Oretown is one of the latest un. provements being agitated by Portland mobilits. W. J. Clemens, almost as well known

as a motor enthusiast as an insurance man, took a trip over the road a week ago and on his return he pronounced the route the only feasible one for an automobile boulevard from Portland to Tillamook and beach points. The chamber of commerce has taken

up the matter and a committee has taken appointed to inspect the road and con-sider whether or not to put itself of-ficially behind the movement to build a pleasantly passable road through the beautiful monntain country to the south ard southward.


