The Cheese Market.

The announcement made recently by one of the leading cheese handlers of the city that the market had touched hot-tom proved correct, for the advance that occurred soon after was followed by another yesterday. The market is very firm and from present indications not be long in reaching a higher level.

The cause of the sudden rise in pric yesterday was the entry into the market of San Francisco and Los Angeles buy ers. There has been a steady demand from Seattle and other Sound points for

from Seattle and other Sound points for some time which has held the market firm, and now on top of this comes the California orders, which have practically cleaned out local stocks. The Tillamook factories are closely sold up, and with the milk supply falling off, it is difficult to see how prices can help advancing. About the only cheese available is the quantity now in transit. The local storage supply is smalk Some Eastern cheese is appearing on the Sound, but at prices that do not compete with the Oregon product. With Californians buying here, it is not pro-bable that any of their make will be available for the local trade. 


