We understand that two propositions are under consideration to furnish the city with electric lights and power for industrial purposes. One is to harness and use the water at Munson's falls, which could be put in for a comparatively small outlay and completed in a few months. The other is to use the north fork of the Wilson river. Notices have also been posted on the Wilson river, near the Rush place, to use the water there, which, it is stated, able to furnish 2,000 horse power.

The Clatsop County Court on Tuesday made an order directing the making of preliminary surveys and estimates of cost of construction of a proposed public highway from Cannon Beach to the Tillamook County line, there to connect with a road which this county is to build from Nehalem City. The completion of these proposed highways will make a good automobile road from Astoria to Tillamook City, and will also tap a rich agricultural district that is now wholly without means of communication with the outside world.

Alex. McNair & Co has brought suit in the county court against Jacob Schweitzer to recover \$67.20 for goods, wares and merchandise furnished the defendant. The complaint sets out that Schweitzer had removed and disposed of his property with intent to defraud his creditors, leaving the city after night-fall so that his movements would not be observed; and that plaintiff is entitled to have defendant arrested for that reason, under the provisions of sec. 260 of Bellinger & Cotton's annotated codes and statutes of Oregon.
