Circuit Court on February 3rd.

Judge Geo. H. Burnett has called a
special session of the Circuit Court for
the 3rd February to take up the cases
which should have been tried at the No-
vember term of court, but which had to
go over on account of the bank holidays.
There are 85 cases on the docket, and
no doubt by stipulation of the attorneys
other cases will be tried. Judge Burnett
will be able to remain in Tillamook to
the end of February so as to clear up the
cases on the docket, and an effort will
be made to try a few criminal cases that
have happened since November. Another
jury will have to be drawn, as the term
for which the November jury was called
lapsed when Governor Chamberlain
failed to proclaim several days bank
holidays, which had the effect of adjourn-
ing court and dismissing the jury. To
prevent this Judge Burnett had planned
to come over and adjourn court until
February when the November jury could
have served, but the governor's negli-
gence makes it necessary to call another
jury.
