

CIRCUIT COURT NEXT WEEK.

A Large Number of Cases on the Docket.

The November term of the Circuit court will convene on Monday, with Judge G. H. Burnett on the bench. The docket is unusually long, with a large number of jury cases, which is liable to extend the session over several weeks. There are several persons held over to the grand jury, and with prospects of that body returning more indictments than usual, the criminal department is liable to take up some time.
