Among the needs of the farmers of Wisconsin, as reported by the Roosevelt Farm Commission, is "the promotion of theory of the intellectual understanding." What has Senator LaFollete been doing all these years?

The \$300,000,000 Panama bond issue has been three times oversubscribed, bids amounting to over \$72,000,000 being rejected. Small holders were favored to a large extent, the full amount being distributed among 159 persons or banks. The National Park Bank of New York leads with \$600,000.

The postmaster general states that postal employees pay surety companies \$200,000 a year and that the average collections by the government from surety companies and individual bondsmen is less than \$30,000. A reduction of rates to the employees would be the fair thing.

"Any man who is a bear on the future of this country," says Pierpont Morgan, "will go broke." But if in the course of financial events Mr. Morgan considers it desirable to change to the bear side he is qualified to spar for second wind a long time.

Two South American cities, Buenos Ayres and Rio Janeiro, have a population respectively of 1,000,000 and 800,000, but they are far more intimate with Europe than with this country. Their passenger traffic with Europe is

fifty times as large as with the United States. The International Bureau of American Republics has a large field for improvement.

Some of the Cuban papers are offended by the remarks in the message on the necessity of good government in the island after the American troops are withdrawn. The Cubans may rest assured that conditions of civil war or anarchy will not be tolerated by this country. It is well to remember that the Platt amendment is part of Cuba's constitution, and means just what it says.

Dr. Harlan Shoemaker of the Methodist Hospital at Philadelphia has inoculated himself, an assistant physician and two nurses with antityphoid serum as an experiment, the first of the kind to be made in this country. Dr. Shoemaker declared that the reactions in all four cases had been satisfactory, the fever and pain lasting four days. The city authorities have great hopes of warding off the epidemic which now threatens the city by general vaccination, as is done in case of yellow fever.

Several New York dentists are experimenting with a new method of making gold fillings which will do away with the tedious pounding now thought necessary. A wax impression of the tooth is taken after the cavity has been prepared for filling, the hole filled with gutta percha and the patient sent on his way. The wax impression is then poised on a slender brass rod and surrounded with a plaster casting. When this sets, the rod is withdrawn, and the wax melted and run out of the hole left by the rod. Molten gold is now poured into the mould. The filling thus made is cemented into the tooth to be filled, the process taking only a few minutes.

Hot Shot for Two Editors.

What President Roosevelt thinks of Delavan Smith, editor of the Indianapolis News, for publishing certain charges or circulating them concerning the alleged connection of the president's brother-in-law, Douglas Robinson, and Charles P. Taft with a syndicate secretly profiting from the purchase of the Panama Canal Company from France, was given to the press in the form of a letter to William Dudley Foulke of Indianapolis. The latter had written the president some time back asking him to reply to these attacks upon the administration. The president justifies his notice of these stories on the ground that reputable people have been misled by them. He says that the statements of Editor Smith are false from beginning to end, knowing and maliciously false, as it is known that all the papers in the Panama purchase have been accessible to any reputable person, and every step in the transaction reported to Congress, and that the \$40,000,000 was paid direct to the French Government, which is the party slandered by these statements.

Having given the lie direct to Editor Smith, who, by the way, is a cousin and ardent supporter of Vice President Fairbanks, the president says that Smith occupies the same evil eminence with such men as Mr. Laffan of the New York Sun. These men as a matter of business practice every form of mendacity known to man, says the president. Editorially the Sun declines "a controversy with Mr. Roosevelt," although not indifferent to the compliment implied in the "tirade" saying that the president has shown in his various collisions with distinguished men "his complete freedom from any sense of personal obligation in respect of the truth." It cannot disguise its chagrin that the person thus addressed is the president of the United States. Editor Smith's answer is that the statements published in the News originated with a New York paper, not the Sun (meaning the World), and that they were repeated by many other papers. He personally was not responsible for the editorial comment made thereon.
