In an interview widely published just before sailing from New York for Europe, Samuel Untermyer, the man who represented the insurance policy holders in their fight with the companies and who has been counsel for Segal against the sugar trust, delivered himself of a broadside against the government for its failure to get after that trust and others of its kind. The sugar trust, he said, happens to be the goat at the moment, but the government had waited until the principal offenders had died. If the government really wanted to bring the criminal rich to justice, it could do so under the law, but there had never been an honest effort to enforce the law. He said they had no trouble in convicting a few struggling and harmless combinations, and continued thus: "But the financial barons who have been holding up the country in the necessities of life, keeping out foreign competition through the tariff at one end and crushing home competition at the other until the increase in the cost of living is alarming, have remained immune until every lawyer who has had to deal with this big question knows that the pretended enforcement of the law is a huge farce." As to the report that Wall street men are regaining their confidence, he says: "For the sake of the country, let us hope that these gentlemen are mistaken for if they are right we shall have an upheaval in this country compared to which the mild and harmless experiments of the last administration will seem like a midsummer zephyr along side a cyclone." Unless these numerous criminal combinations were strangled, the future was fraught with danger, and he dreaded the awakening. He insisted that the sugar trust was no worse than many others.
