## Commissioners' Court.

The Board of County Commissioners, composed of Judge Goodspeed and Commissioners Boylefield and Alley, was in session last week and transacted the following business:

In the matter of incorporating the Port of Nehalem, a petition having been filed, a special election was called for November 2.

It was ordered that the claim of road viewers for the Isaac Steinon road for the sum of \$15 be continued.

Claim of Watt Bros. for supplies for the sum of \$22 was continued.

In the matter of the application of Carl Possetti and others for a county road, it was ordered that Otto Schrader, Henry Rogers and Samuel Dailey be appointed a board of county viewers, to meet 18th Oct.

In the matter of the claim of Gottlieb Wyss, administrator of the estate of Alfred Wyss, for damages, was dismissed.

In the matter of the application of Ella Hinkle for cancellation of taxes, the same was rejected.

In the matter of the cancelling of court warrants, those not taken up issued prior to July 1, 1902, were ordered cancelled.

In the matter of the position of Luke Wolfe for a gateway, it was ordered that Otto Schrader, Lewis Johnson and T. J. Bibby be appointed viewers, to meet the 11th October.

In the matter of the resignation of N. Olsen as constable, the same was accepted and E. E. Laughlin was appointed to fill the vacancy.

In the matter of the application of Charles Pike and others for the location of a county road, Otto Schrader, A. Ben-scheidt and S. W. Elliott were appointed a board of county viewers, to meet 4th October.
