Lyle Wright and Annie Lyle Wright, the sum of \$2000.00, together with interest thereon at the rate of 7 per cent per annum from January 4th, 1907, the sum of \$100.00 as attorney's fees, and their costs and disbursements, taxed at \$8.35.

The judgments of the said defendants and the defendant, A. R. Gangloff, be binding upon the defendants, J. Lyle Wright and Annie Lyle Wright only to the extent of the proceeds realized, or to be realized from the sale of the premises herein described, and the proceeds of which property the notes and mortgages hereinbefore mentioned were given.
