Fraudulent Prescriptions

Ed. Hadley Surrenders.

Illingsworth is Guilty.

Joe Illingsworth was the only case to be tried, and it went to trial on Friday, concluding on Saturday, with the result that he was promptly found guilty by the jury upon the evidence of A. H. Beaty, Fred N. Robin, who is in the employ of the Anti-Saloon League and Sheriff H. Crenshaw.

Judge Hears Evidence.

When the bootleg cases were called on Monday there was a large attendance in the court room, and the judge told Deputy District Attorney Cooper that he wanted to hear some evidence in the cases, and he call for A. H. Beaty to take the stand. He was not in the court room at the time, and Attorney Holmes remarked "He's in jail!"

Law Must be Obeyed.

Judge Burnett, in passing sentence upon those who had been convicted or pleaded guilty of violating the local option law, said that it appeared to him that a wholesale violation of the law had been going on, and that Tillamook County had obtained a bad reputation as being the most lawless county in his district.

local option law must be obeyed, as it was the will of the people that it became a law. Attorney had attacked the law in many ways in the courts and the courts had decided that the local option was constitutional and a law of the State, and must be obeyed and enforced like all other laws.

Bootleggers Surprised.

Lamar was the first to hear the judge's sentence which sent him to jail, and as the judge sent one after another to durance vile in quick succession, the "bootleggers" looked surprised and shocked, for they did not expect jail sentence. He made an exception to this in the Othier and York cases, where he imposed fines only. As Illingsworth had put the county to the expense of going to trial, his sentence would be heavier than it otherwise would have been had he pleaded guilty.

Glenn H. Johnson Gives Himself Up.

Glenn H. Johnson, who was indicted by the grand jury for violating the local option law, and who hid himself to avoid arrest, gave himself up on Wednesday, and his case was put over until the April term, the bail being placed at \$200, which he furnished.

The Growing Suicide Record.

According to figures carefully collected in sixty-five American cities, with a population of seventeen and a half million, there is a steady increase in the rate of suicide in the United States. The figure in 1908 was 21.8 per 100,000 of population, or higher by ever one point than the exceptionally high rate of 1907. In the analysis of the details it is shown that suicide is most frequent in the larger cities and in the Western States, and least frequent in the Southern group.

The fact that the suicide rate is growing in the country calls upon sociologists and legislators for thought and action. If suicide is not always a proof of an unbalanced mind it indicates a diseased will, but causes exist also in social and industrial conditions, such as lack of work and physical suffering. The United States is the richest and busiest of nations and also the one offering the best opportunities to each individual. But its growing rate of suicide is not encouraging. One point brought out is that the drift of population from country to cities is attended by some moral deterioration and by a rise in the rate of self-murder. As long as this rate grows faster than the rate of increase in population the subject of suicide will demand special study.
