Tillamook Jottings.

The body of Nellie Hunter, the little girl drowned when the life-savers' boat capsized in the breakers on Garibaldi beach at the time of the Argo wreck, was found by Captain Wicklund, of the Hammond life saving crew, on Friday. The body was brought to Tillamook on the steamer Sue H. Elmore and was buried on Wednesday.

Postmaster Severance moved the post office to the concrete building on Wednesday evening, the Tillamook Building Company having leased the building to the government for five years. The new office is a great improvement and is in keeping with the growth and development of the city, and those who were enterprising enough to give the city a commodious, up-to-date post office are deserving of a great deal of credit. This is the second time that Postmaster Severance has moved the post office, the first time from Main street when it was a 4th class office.

A special meeting of the stockholders of the Tillamook County Mutual Telephone Company has been ordered, and it is called to meet on December 21st, 1909, at the Court House, in Tillamook City, Oregon, at 1 p.m., for the purpose of considering the proposition made by the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company to sell to the Tillamook County Mutual Telephone Company all of its line in Tillamook

County, Oregon, except its line lying from Tillamook City, Oregon, east to the county line, and to accept or reject the same, and for the purpose of considering the matter of increasing the capital stock of this company to not to exceed twenty thousand dollars.

There will be a debate on Saturday evening at the opera house between Tillamook and Nehalem High Schools upon the question: Resolved, that life imprisonment, with restricted power of pardon, should be substituted for capital punishment in Oregon. Affirmative is taken by the Tillamook High School, and is represented by Eliza Dawson, Oscar Aschim and Robert Stillwell. Nehalem takes the negative, and is represented by Oscar Effenberger, Agnes Zaddach and Hermann Schollmeyer. This is the second interscholastic debate ever held in Tillamook, and with a good musical program it will make a most pleasant evening's enjoyment.

Congressman Hawley put in a good word at the Rivers and Harbors Congress at Washington, and now that we have a congressman who has his mind made up that he is going to get an appropriation for the improvement of Tillamook bar, every lick he makes in that direction counts. In a brief news dispatch from Washington he is reported as saying, "At Tillamook the engineers, notwithstanding the direction of Congress, had made no survey, but had submitted an adverse report. This, he maintained,

was unjust, and he strongly recommended that the committee adopt the new project for this locality on which Government and local interests could co-operate."
