LYTLE CONTRADICTS A SILLY REPORT.

Originating in Astoria about the P. R. & N. Co.'s Road.

(From Forest Grove Times).

E. E. Lytle, president of the Pacific Railway & Navigation Company, condemned as incredible the report that emanated from Astoria that the line to Tillamook is nothing more than a logging road and not intended for freight and passenger business, by propounding the question "Who ever heard of a logging road constructed at a cost of \$40,000 per mile?"

During the past year a goodly number of transactions have taken place in the region touched by the new line, on the strength of the building of the road with the understanding that it would give access to Tillamook and the numerous beaches from Nehalem Bay to Tillamook Bay. Much acreage fronting on the sea shore has been platted into resorts

and Astoria neighboring beaches, it is said, fear that the summer crowds will diminish if the Lytle road proves a competitor to the Hill road.

Active construction work is the order of the day on the P. R. & N.'s line and work trains which do passenger and freight traffic are being run as far as the thirty-mile post, west from Hillsboro. Corduroy roads are being built by the Sweeney Construction Company for the transportation of building materials and equipment beyond that point and already nine miles of wagon road have been completed.

The building of the railroad line to Buxton and timber districts has increased the value of timber claims and property along the line. For instance, it is said that \$15,000 was offered for the Goodwin quarter section some time since and that another party was offered \$3,000 for a holding in that vicinity.

Mr. Lytle, when apprised of the

rumor, that the road was being built exclusively for logging purposes, had created considerable excitement among property holders in the affected district, as without means of transportation present values, based on the coming of the road, would scarcely stand, said to the representative of a Portland paper: "Why, it is absurd. Of course, the report came from Astoria; Astoria does not want the road built at all. It never did."

"We are pushing work as rapidly as possible, and expect to have trains in operation by August 1. At present, 1500 men are engaged on the work, and they are certainly doing something."

"The report has it that the road contains too many sharp curves, and too steep a grade to make it practical for passenger traffic," Mr. Lytle was told.

"Curves and grades? We have no steeper grade than the maximum of the Southern Pacific to California,

which is 3 per cent, and as for curves, there is not one exceeding 15 degrees. You must not lose sight of the fact that we have 19 tunnels on that stretch of approximately 91 miles of road from Hillsboro to Tillamook. These tunnels should do away with some of the grade that seems to frighten those who might have started the rumor.

"The road will cost in the neighborhood of \$4,000,000, including the cost of equipment, and passenger and freight trains will be operated to supply every demand.

"As far as logging goes, we do not own a tract of timber in that district. Of course, it taps a rich timber country, and logs will, of course, be hauled if they are offered, but it will only be part of the business. Construction is progressing nicely. We are working from both ends, having already laid 35 miles of track out of Hillsboro and 10 miles out of Tillamook. This leaves about half of the distance yet to be covered."
