But perhaps we are mistaken, for it may be that the city council expects the street commissioner to boss the work and not turn in and help himself. Yet it appears to us poor economy to employ a person to clean off the cross walks and have the street commissioner boss one man. It may not be very agreeable weather to keep the cross walks free of mud, but we notice that those who come to the city to do their trading, and the women and children, have to wade through the mud.

As the city grows, with a large number of strangers coming here, there appears to be a tendency on the part of some to get as much credit and backing from the business men as possible, and in consequence, business men are liable to loose considerable money. If the city had a commercial club, with a business men's protective association connected with it, the business men would run less risk of losing money on account of giving credit to unreliable persons. This is something which concerns all the business men and they should get together for mutual protection, not only so, but the business men are pestered with fakers and advertising schemes, and no sooner does one business man succumb to the devices of getting easy money from business men than others fall into it also, the result of which is the fakers and advertising schemes pocket a good deal of money which does the business men no good whatever. It is the same way with the calendar business, thousands of dollars are extracted from the business men on account of it. Anyway, it would be a good thing for the business men to get together for mutual protect and insist on a cash business as much as possible in the future, especially from strangers.

Another mysterious fire, which is believed to be incendiary, occurred in this city early Tuesday morning, is a matter which vitally concern property owners and the business men who carry valuable stocks in their stores. But as long as they remain indifferent and will not insist upon better protection their is no telling when their property and stores and the entire city will be wiped out with a big conflagration. The fire early Tuesday morning is another object lesson, and brings home to those who have interests in this city an alarming condition of affairs. Now is the time to act together, not after some worthless individual or drunken act, without a cents interest in the city, have started a fire, carrying with it destruction of property and probable loss of life, for there is no telling when once a fire is started in this city, where it is going to end and who it will leave penniless.

The Headlight sounds this note of warning in the interest of the property owners and business men, and in doing so we make a public request that a thorough investigation be made by the mayor and the city council as to fire, the whereabouts of the night watchman and the drunken rowdism and filthy language which was used previous to the fire near and in the Allen House.
