

COUNTY BUSINESS.

Let for Two Steel and One Combination Bridges.

CITY ROAD TAX SUIT County Allows City Half of 1909 Road Tax and Cancels 1909 Levy within City.

The Board of County Commissioners met last week, with Commissioners G. W. Bodyfelt and H. V. Alley and County Judge H. F. Goodspeed present, when the following business was transacted.

In the matter of the approval of the deed of dedication, plat and field notes of Norton's addition to Tillamook City, the same were approved.

In the matter of the appeal to the Supreme Court from the decision of the Circuit Court for this county in the case of Tillamook City vs. Tillamook County, it was ordered that an appeal be taken from the order and decree rendered on February 1, 1910, to the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon, that the attorney for the defendant in said cause give notice of such appeal and take necessary steps for the perfecting thereof, and that the County Judge be and is authorized and directed to execute in the name of and on behalf of Tillamook County an undertaking and to procure the necessary sureties therein.

In the matter of the bids of Columbia Bridge Company for the construction of steel bridges across the Big Nestucca for \$5,580 and approach \$3.25 per foot, and Trask, \$4,470, approach \$3.25 per foot, the same were accepted.

In the matter of taxes for the year 1908 on property in Tillamook City, whereas an order was made directing the Treasurer to set aside to the credit of Tillamook City one half or four mills of the road tax, and the city having refused to accept or receive the money, and whereas the Supreme Court has decided that the city is entitled to collect or receive only 1 1/2 mills, it was ordered that the order made March 9, 1909, and confirmed on April 9, 1909, be set aside and rescinded, and the treasurer was ordered to set aside to the credit of Tillamook City 1 1/2 mills only of all the road taxes levied in 1908, within the corporate limits.

In the matter of approval of the plat of Brighton Beach, the same was approved.

In the matter of the approval of the plat of Kiawanda, the same was approved.

In the matter of advertising for wood, the county clerk was ordered to advertise for 100 cords of alder, hemlock or fir.

In the matter of bonds for the supervisors, all were approved.

It was ordered that the petition of J. E. Reedy to be appointed as county Veterinary be continued.

In the matter of the resignation of E. M. Farmer, supervisor of R. D. No. 3, Forrest J. Ayer was appointed to fill the vacancy.

In the matter of the petition to form a Port of Nestucca, which is to comprise the following territory: All that part of Tillamook County lying south of the south boundary line of township 2 south and west of the east boundary line of range 9 west and north of the south boundary line of township 5 south, being all of township 3 south, range 10 west township 3 south, range 11 west; township 4 south, range 11 west; township 5 south, range 11 west and all of townships 4 south, range 9 west, it was ordered that a special election be held in the proposed district on the 27th April, 1910.

In the matter of the petition to create a Port of Bay City, which embraces territory adjacent to Bay City, the court ordered a special election to be held on the 27th April, 1910.

In the matter of bids for bridges across the Nestucca, the Trask River and the south fork of Nehalem river, it was ordered that the following bids be rejected:

Columbia Bridge Company, Nehalem bridge, \$8,900.

Atlas Bridge Company, Nehalem bridge, steel and wood, \$8,320; steel, \$3,000; Big Nestucca, \$6,000; steel, \$3,500; Trask river, steel, \$4,975.

Walter D. Wood, Nestucca, steel, \$3,405; Nehalem, steel, \$8,630; Trask, \$5,000.

In the matter of the bid of Walter Wood for the construction of a bridge across the South Fork of Nehalem, for \$3,735.00, the same was accepted. The approaches be \$3.75 per foot and \$5 per foot where piling is to be used.

In the matter of the levy for road taxes on 1909 tax roll on property in Tillamook City, whereas the Supreme Court has decided that persons and property within the corporate limits are exempt from road taxes for county road purposes, and whereas there was levied by the court for the year 1909 and added on the tax roll for the year 1909 a tax for road purposes of 6

mills, which was illegal, it was ordered that the tax levy be cancelled and the sheriff was ordered to credit upon the tax roll as erroneous, and deduct from the taxes such illegal road taxes.

In the matter of the road taxes collected upon property within the limits of Tillamook City for the year 1908, in which Tillamook City brought suit against the county for all of the money collected for road taxes on property within said city for various years prior to 1908, and judgment has been rendered in favor of city for upwards of \$6,000 upon a verdict rendered by Judge G. H. Burnett, and whereas the Supreme Court has decided that the city is not entitled to recover more than 1 1/2 mills, and as the city has received more than that amount, and whereas it is desired by the County to have the matter disposed of, notwithstanding that the court had formerly ordered only 1 1/2 mills paid the city, the county was willing to allow the city the full half, provided the city will relinquish its claim to receive anything under the judgment, the county judge being authorized to make these arrangements.
