OBTAINED DEED BY FRAUD. Supreme Court Sustains the Lower Court in the Boelk vs. Nolan Case.

The Supreme Court has handed down a decree in the case of Herman Boelk vs. Oak Nolan, sustaining Judge Burnett's decision in the circuit court. Nolan appealed from a decree, cancelling for fraud, a deed executed by plaintiff at Vina, California, on October 8, 1907, purporting to convey to defendant 160 acres of land in this county for the consideration of \$25, and requiring defendant to re-convey the land to plaintiff. Nolan obtained this deed from Boelk, who is a German of very little education and did not readily comprehend the significance of writing, under false representation, who claimed that Frank Ekroth had lost all of his own property and had claimed to own plaintiff's property, that against the latter there was a tax title, that Ekroth had bid it in, and had made some kind of a conveyance to one of the Harrisons, who claimed to own the land by deed from Ekroth, that there were two suits pending involving the title to the land, that the title to the land was much involved and doubtful, and was probably lost to the plaintiff, and that the defendant had the Harrison deed and wanted to get a good title to the land. He then impudently plaintiff to execute a deed, conveying to him the land for the nominal sum of \$25, whereas the land was worth \$2,500. The Court holds it was the duty of Nolan, when he undertook to inform plaintiff about the condition of the latter's title to the land, to make a full, truthful and complete declaration of all the conditions within his knowledge affecting it, and his failure so to do amounts to such a fraud as entitles Boelk to a cancellation of his deed. Nolan has applied for a re-hearing.
