Natural Gas. Natural gas is a member of the paraffin series formed by the decomposition of animal matter, as in Ohio and Indiana gas, and from vegetable matter, as in Pennsylvania gas, this decay having occurred within the rocks and probably at moderate temperatures. When once formed it accumulates in the pores of the rocks in which it originated or in the overlying layers, but is usually kept from escaping to the surface by the presence of some layers of impervious rock. It is then obtained by the piercing of these strata by wells, or where the beds have been fissured by folding or faulting it may issue from natural channels. - New York American.
