ASTORIA, Or., Sept. 12 -A deal was closed this morning whereby the Astoria, Seaside & Tillamook Railway Company acquires possession of what is known as the Reed Railroad grade, extending from a connection with the Astoria & Columbia River Railroad, at Clatsop congress, even after they are City, up the Lewis & Clark River to the tunnel in Saddle Mountain, a distance of about 21 miles. The

purchase also includes 80 acres of land at Clatsop City.




