THREE MEN DROWNED AT NEHALEM.

Met their Death While Forging the River when it was Dangerous to Do So.

An accident of a most serious nature happened at what is known as the Steve Scovell ford on the North Fork of the Nehalem, Monday morning, which resulted in the drowning of three men. August Davidson had started with Louis Blatler and Louis Neiderberger to haul their milk to the creamery, and upon driving the team into the river they discovered, when too late, that it was dangerous to ford the river. No one witnessed the accident, but the wagon must have been turned over by the swift current, and all three men met a watery grave, as well as the team, which belonged to R. Zwiefel. It is reported that there were eight feet of water at the ford. As her husband did not return at the usual hour, Mrs. Davidson became uneasy, and a search being made it was soon discovered that a fatal accident had occurred in finding the wagon and drowned team. Next morning the body of Davidson was found and later the bodies of Blatler and Neiderberger were found under the wagon box. Sheriff Crenshaw was called to hold an inquest over the bodies, and the jury brought in a verdict that the men met their death by accidental drowning.

The Election.

The election on Tuesday resulted in the election of the entire state Republican ticket with the exception of Bowerman who was beaten by West, the Democratic nominee, by several thousand votes. State wide prohibition failed and it is claimed that the home rule bill passed. Every Republican on the county ticket is elected. Beals and Kunze ran close in this county but the former has a good majority in Yamhill county. For Circuit Judges it is generally conceded that Judge Galloway has been re-elected and Percy Kelly will be the other successful candidate. Tillamook County went "wet," beating the "drys" with over 300 votes to spare. Vote in Tillamook County with several precincts missing: Congress.
