CONTRACTS TO BE LET.

United Railways to Complete Road into Tillamook in 12 Months.

In the Oregonian of the 9th Mr. Stevens says:

"We shall endeavor to complete the United Railways to Tillamook within one year, and to do so will probably require the awarding of some contracts this winter. At the present rate of progress on the United Railways work, however, it may require 18 months to complete the Tillamook line."

On the United Railways, construction is now in progress between Burlington, the present terminus, and Banks, and when completed it will extend the railroad to a length of 24 miles. The total distance between Portland and Tillamook will be 72 miles by the United Railways route, but construction will prove heavier than on the Oregon Electric extensions. It will also be a different type of railroad from the Willamette valley electric lines. Expense is not to be spared in avoiding grades and curvatures, for rapid transit is one of the main features sought on the beach line. A running time of two hours between Portland and the ocean is promised.

In the 24 miles now under construction is located the mile-long tunnel at Cornelius gap, on which work is being pressed as rapidly as possible. The road to Banks, it is expected, will be completed with the exception of the tunnel, and in operation within a few weeks. Temporarily the west end of the line to Banks will be operated by steam and temporary tracks will be used over the gap. Contracts have been let for electrical machinery costing about \$90,000 and construction has begun on a permanent sub-station to replace the temporary station at Burlington. Another sub-station has been located at a point near the tunnel known as Helvetia. Orders have been placed for two modern coaches to give additional equipment.
