received from the Oregon Association a number of commendations for the regulation of saloons, if adopted and eliminated some of the recommendations in the regulations governing the sale of liquor.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE SALE OF LIQUOR.

1. The license fee should not be an exorbitant tax on the business. We suggest that the yearly fee be in proportion to the traffic and number of saloons permitted. Extreme license fees lead to adulteration of goods, treating, in order to increase revenues, and violations of the laws.

2. Some towns have provided that each applicant for license must furnish a surety bond of \$1000.00 in addition to license fee, to guarantee the strict observance of all laws, same to be forfeited when license is revoked. This is a matter for local decision.

QUALIFICATIONS OF APPLICANT.

1st. If an individual he, if a firm they, must be American citizens.
2nd. He or they must make affidavit that he or they have never been convicted of a felony.
3rd. He or they must make affidavit that his or their license has never been revoked for violation of liquor laws.
4th. He or they must make affidavit that he or they have not knowingly within a period of twelve months permitted a female to remain longer in their place of business than was necessary to eject her. This should not apply to keepers of hotels and restaurants.
5th. He or they must make affidavit that he or they have not sold to minors, habitual drunkards or intoxicated persons, or permitted them to frequent their place of business during the preceding twelve months.
6th. He or they must make affidavit that he or they have not violated any of the laws governing the sale of liquor during the preceding twelve months.
7th. Make it compulsory upon each applicant to file annually an affidavit as outlined in Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, under the heading "Qualifications of Applicant."
8th. Provide that all applicants for renewal of a license, upon full compliance with the foregoing requirements, shall be entitled to such renewal, except that the Council shall reserve the right and may at any time revoke for cause.

GOOD WORD FOR ALLEY.

Nehalem Newspaper Says it is Rank Injustice to Invoke Recall on Commissioner.

According to reliable information we learn that two of our prominent citizens went down through the southern part of the county with a petition to secure signatures to invoke the recall on Commissioner Alley. In our opinion it is a rank injustice to Mr. Alley or anyone else to have a recall petition circulated in a territory where people cannot and do not know the facts involved. If the grounds were sufficient to warrant this move why was it not circulated in this precinct first where the work of our Commissioner would show for itself without exaggerating or deducting therefrom? In this instance, however, it is entirely uncalled for.

Commissioner Alley has the individual support of the great majority of his constituents in this vicinity and should it result in a special election we are quite sure that he would be re-elected by an overwhelming majority. Therefore, we deem the action of the persons circulating the petition unnecessary and uncalled for to say the least; and they need not expect the approval or sanction of our people by so doing. On the contrary it will work to their disadvantage.

In outlining the work done by Mr. Alley during the past three years, we find that he has done all that could be expected of any man as a public official who has so many to please. There are but three prime objects in view which will require the future attention of our Commissioner, having declared himself to that effect. These are as follows: Putting crushed rock on the roads now built, build a road to the Wheeler property, and finish the Necarney road to connect with Clatsop County. When this is done we will have the situation well in hand. A renewal of the strife that was so marked in the past would frustrate all plans for the betterment of the entire Nehalem Valley, and we sincerely trust that this may not be repeated in the future; which will undoubtedly be the case unless this agitation is stopped at once.—Nehalem Enterprise.
