Help boost the county.

Gee! Even in dining and winning the county editors there are those among the pencil pushers who are still in the "dry" column.

Don't erect any more concrete buildings without providing for paved sheets. A modern, up-to-date building with a muddy, dirty road in front of it, don't compare very favorably.

Speaker Rusk indicated his confidence in the ability and integrity of Representative A. G. Beals by appointing him on the special committee of five having in charge the investigation of the asylum management.

Business men, who are pestered every once in a while with advertising fakirs will be able to get rid of them by referring them to the association. Instead of supporting advertising fakirs, let the business men help the publicity fund.

It is reported that Bay City is to have another newspaper. The city on the bay would be showing better judgment if the people there would give the Bay City News its unanimous support, which it is justly entitled to. Not only will another newspaper in that city prove a financial failure, but it is sure to widen the breach of factional strife at a time when there should be united effort to boost that city. As one of the editor-boosters of the county we want to give a word of fatherly advice, and that is to cut out all factional strife and rally to the support of the present newspapers.

When the city gave the five saloons a monopoly of the saloon business it made a good many person look up and take notice that the license was not raised to \$1,000. Somehow or other individual interests have to be pandered to. It was the same way about closing the saloons at night, the "special interests," not the welfare of the city, had to be considered. Wonder whether those who voted "wet" ever thought that they would have to pay \$1,000 a

glass for beer and 15c. a drink for whiskey? Isn't that rubbing it into the "wets" good and hard, as well as making those who patronize the saloons pay an exorbitant price for their drink. So much for the saloon monopoly in this city.

The Smith boys are again in jail and the taxpayers are put to the expense, not only of prosecuting them, but have to board them. There is something wrong somewhere, for the boys appear as though they would rather be in jail than have their liberty. Is this the fault of their parents, their home, their environments, or are their parents to blame for sparing the rod and not keeping the boys under restraint? Probably the boys are not so much at fault after all when the conditions surrounding their young lives are taken into consideration. We hear quite often about bad boys and bad girls, but it is often comfortless homes and the bad example of the parents which help to make bad boys and bad girls, and in some cases we think it would be more sensible to lock up the parents, for, to a large extent, this is where the blame belongs. When boys are allowed to drift along, with no work or ambition to employ their time and mind, with little comfort in the home, and bad example set by parents, it is not very surprising, after all, that there are so many bad boys.

The editors of the county had one object in meeting in this city on Monday, and it was to get together and boost the entire county. For the next few years it will be necessary for Tillamook county to do a large amount of publicity work for the purpose of inducing industries and new settlers to locate here, for the only way to succeed is to get in and hustle like other parts of Oregon. This is what the Tillamook County Editor-Boosters' Association is going to do, but it will be necessary for them to have the moral and financial support of the commercial bodies and business men. Heretofore, comparatively little money have been expended in publicity work for Tillamook county, the burden of this having fallen on the newspaper men. Of the numerous functions of the Tillamook Commercial Club and other like organizations, this is the most important work just now for the whole county, and the sooner they admit this, much easier will it be for the editors to obtain results for the efforts they intend to make to develop, open up and populate the county, as well as induce industries to locate here. The editors are showing their patriotism and faith in Tillamook county, and it is to be hoped that it will be the means of permeating the boosting and get together spirit all over the county. It is going to take a good deal of persistent effort and entail considerable expense for a publicity campaign for Tillamook county for the next few years. The editors will do their part, and all others should help this good work along and subscribe a certain amount every year for that purpose.
