

Proclamation.

Whereas, Ordinance No. 221, was passed by the City Council of Tillamook City, Oregon, on the 14th day of July, 1911, and was submitted to the legal voters of said city for their approval or rejection, at a special election called for that purpose, and held in said city on the 25th day of July, 1911, said Ordinance No. 221 being as follows, to-wit:—

ORDINANCE No. 221. The people of Tillamook City do Ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.—That Section 2 of Article VII. of an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the city of Tillamook City, in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 13, 1893, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SECTION 2.—No improvements, or alterations, or establishment of any grade, or improvement of any street, sidewalk, or pavement, or the construction of any sewer mentioned in the preceding section, can be undertaken or made without seven days' notice thereof being first given by one publication in a newspaper published in Tillamook City, or by posting a notice in three public places in said city, except as in this act otherwise provided.

SECTION 3.—That Section 3 of Article VII. of an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the city of Tillamook City, in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 13, 1893, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SECTION 3.—Such notice must be given by the recorder by order of the common council, and must specify with convenient certainty the street, alley, sidewalk, pavement, or sewer, or the part thereof proposed to be established or altered, and the kind of improvement which is proposed to be made, and the time when the council will hear and determine Proclamation, Ordinance No. 221, objections and remonstrances thereto, if any.

SECTION 4.—That Section 4 of Article VII. of an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the city of Tillamook City, in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 13, 1893, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SECTION 4.—The council at the time specified in said notice or such other time as they may adjourn the hearing, shall hear and determine all objections or remonstrances which may be made by the adjacent property holder or taxpayer, and after said hearing, the council shall determine by resolution whether or not the improvement of the street, alley, sidewalk, or pavement, or the alteration or establishment of the grade, or the construction or repair of the sewer specified in said notice, shall be made or not; provided, said determination be made within two weeks of hearing objections to said notice.

SECTION 5.—That Section 5 of Article VII. of an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the city of Tillamook City, in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 13, 1893, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SECTION 5.—In all cases, the notice for the improvement, alteration, or repair of a street, alley, sidewalk, or pavement, or the construction or repair of a sewer, whether in whole or in part thereof, the common council shall direct said improvement, alteration, or repair to be made by the owners of the lots abutting thereon, or adjacent thereto, within thirty days, under the supervision of the street commissioner.

SECTION 6.—In all cases, the notice for the improvement, alteration, or repair of a street, alley, sidewalk, or pavement, or the construction or repair of a sewer, whether in whole or in part thereof, the common council shall direct said improvement, alteration, or repair to be made by the owners of the lots abutting thereon, or adjacent thereto, within thirty days, under the supervision of the street commissioner.

SECTION 7.—That Section 7 of Article VII. of an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the city of Tillamook City, in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 13, 1893, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SECTION 7.—When the cost of the improvement, alteration, or repairs is determined, and the provisions thereof have been provided in section 6 of this ordinance, the recorder shall enter in the docket of the city, and provide in the next section, where written application is made with the city recorder to have the assessment in installment, as provided in section 1 of this ordinance.

SECTION 8.—That Section 8 of Article VII. of an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the city of Tillamook City, in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 13, 1893, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SECTION 8.—The docket of City of Tillamook in which be provided in Ordinance No. 221, entered in accordance of Sections 6, 7, and 8 of this article, the following:—

SECTION 9.—The improvement, alteration, or construction of streets, sidewalks, pavements or other public works, shall be designated as follows:—

3.—The sum assessed upon such tract of land, and the date thereof.

4.—A brief statement of the improvement, alteration, or repair for which such assessment is made.

SECTION 7.—That Section 16 of Article VII. of an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the city of Tillamook City, in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 13, 1893, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SECTION 16.—The person executing such warrant shall immediately issue a certificate of sale to the purchaser for the property sold, stating therein that the same is made subject to redemption, and that a deed will be issued thereon by the then acting Marshal at the expiration of the time of redemption as provided herein. Within one year from the date of sale, the owner, or his successor in interest, or any person having a valid lien of record, or any person having a lien by judgment, decree, or mortgage on the property or any part thereof separately sold, may redeem the same upon the terms and conditions provided in the next section.

SECTION 18.—That Section 18, of Article VII. of an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the city of Tillamook City, in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 13, 1893, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SECTION 18.—A redemption discharges the property from the effects of the sale upon the assessment. If made by the owner or his successor in interest, the estate in the property is thereby restored to such owner or his successor in interest, as the case may be, if made by a lien creditor, the amount paid for the redemption is there after to be deemed a part of his lien, judgment, decree, or mortgage, as the case may be, and shall bear like interest, and may be enforced and collected as a part thereof.

SECTION 9.—That Article VII. of an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the city of Tillamook City, in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 13, 1893, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section, Section 20.

SECTION 20. 1.—Whenever any street improvement, or the construction of any sewer or sewers is ordered, and the cost thereof is assessed to the property benefited thereby, or liable therefor, the owner of any such property, where such cost is \$25.00 or more, may within ten days after notice is given of such improvement or construction, as the case may be, file with the city recorder a written application to pay said assessment in installments, and such written application shall state that the applicant and property owner thereby waives all irregularities or defects, jurisdictional or otherwise, in the proceedings to improve the street or lay the sewer for which said assessment is levied and in the apportionment of the cost thereof.

SECTION 20. 2.—The common council shall provide by ordinance for carrying out the provisions of this section for the issuing of improvement bonds under the terms hereof.

SECTION 20. 3.—No obligation incurred by Tillamook City by virtue of this section shall be deemed or taken to be within any part of the limitation by law as to the indebtedness of this city. And,

Whereas, at said election there were cast for said Ordinance No. 221, 65 votes, and against said Ordinance No. 221, 32 votes. And,

Whereas, there was a majority of votes cast thereon in favor of said Ordinance No. 221.

Now, therefore, I do hereby proclaim that the said Ordinance No. 221 has been approved by the legal voters of said Tillamook City, and is therefore in full force and effect, and the Charter of said city is amended as provided by said Ordinance No. 221.

Death of William Curtis.

On Saturday morning, Wm. Curtis, a much respected citizen of Tillamook for the past twenty years, passed away after an illness of several weeks. He was taken suddenly ill last spring with an internal abscess and from that time on was confined to his bed nearly all the time until his death. Everything possible was done for his relief and recovery, but to no avail.

Following is a short history of his life:

William Curtis was born at Brookbrook, Franklin County, N. Y., Dec., 16, 1850. He left New York in 1853, going to Wisconsin; from there he moved to Minnesota in 1875. In 1889 he came to Oregon, settling at McMinnville, where he resided but a short time, coming on to Tillamook where he has since made his home, until he passed away, Aug., 5, 1911, being 61 years, 7 months and 30 days old. He leaves a mother, two brothers and three sisters to mourn their loss: David Curtis, Mrs. Jennie McGhee, Mrs. Anna Bellings, Mrs. Nellie Murphy, of this county, and Chas. H. Curtis, of Seattle.

The deceased had been manager of the Ray Feed Company of this city for some time and was identified with other business interests of the city.

The funeral services were held at the M. E. Church of this city, Rev. Shrode preaching the funeral sermon. The I.O.O.F., Lodge, of which he was a member, attended in a body and took charge of the services at the I.O.O.F. cemetery.

The church was filled to its utmost capacity and a large concourse of sorrowing friends followed the remains to the cemetery.
