

PORT CASE.

File General to Defendants' answer.

Attorney Duniway has filed a general denial in answer to the Port's answer to the complaint, which we give in full, as the case is of much interest to the people of this county at the present time. It is as follows:

These plaintiffs deny that the Port of Tillamook created by the Legislature in 1899, is a valid municipal corporation under the laws of Oregon, that it is and has been exercising all the powers and authority given it by said act of the Legislature, and has been levying and expending taxes, for the purpose of its incorporation ever since it was incorporated.

Plaintiffs deny that at the election held for the incorporation of the defendant Port of Tillamook the voters residing in said territory participated in said election, and plaintiffs deny that due notice or any notice was given, and plaintiffs deny that all or nearly all of the voters residing within said territory voted at said election.

Plaintiffs deny that the act of the Legislature of 1899, at pages 419-423 inclusive, and referred to in plaintiffs' complaint, was and is unconstitutional and void, and these plaintiffs allege that said Legislative act is legal and constitutional and that said Port of Tillamook created by said Legislative act as a duly organized municipal corporation which has organized and exercising its corporate functions ever since it was created and is now exercising its corporate functions.

Cloverdale has been a little slow, we must admit, in formulating such an organization. Her citizens are conservative, but like all conservative people when they move it is with a firm foundation underlying their efforts, with a thorough knowledge of what they are going into and with such knowledge and backing step by step the top round of the ladder is reached with almost an absolute assurance from the start.

Saturday last the first step was taken by the organization of a Commercial Club, and backing the club are the best men of the community. A temporary chairman and secretary, Mr. Dennis and Mr. Owen respectively, were chosen. A committee was also appointed to draft a constitution and by-laws, to be adopted at the next meeting, Saturday evening, when the permanent organization will be perfected.

It is desired that this organization be membershiped with every booster in this locality. The larger the organization the greater the strength, and if you are a booster your name should be enrolled on the parchment that constitutes the membership of the Cloverdale Commercial Club.
