OREGON SYSTEM FIGHTS FOR ITS LIFE. Initiative and Referendum Attacked. Washington, Sept. 24.—The constitutionality of the initiative and referendum, the famous "Oregon system" of popular government, will be the subject of a decision with far-reaching consequences by the Supreme Court of the United States... Case Originated in the company's challenge of a law enacted by the Oregon Legislature under the initiative plan, by which a tax of 2 per cent was placed on the gross earnings of telegraph and telephone companies... State Courts Decide for Law. The state thereupon brought a suit. There was a hard fight in the trial court, but the decision was favorable to the law. A like conclusion was reached by the Supreme Court of the state... Senator Norris Brown, of Nebraska, a staunch believer in the initiative and referendum, has been engaged by the state of Oregon to argue this case before the Supreme Court...
