The most important case, to the people of Oregon, and to the people of the United States at large, pending in the United States Supreme Court is that of the Pacific States Telephone and Telegraph Company against the State of Oregon. It is on a writ of error from the Supreme Court of the United States to the Supreme Court of Oregon, and arose

on an action at law brought by the State of Oregon' against the com-Field. pany to recover a license tax on its gross earnings, claimed to have accrued for the year ending December 31, 1906, alleged to be due under an initiative law, passed by a vote of the people of Oregon June 4, 1906, requiring express, telephone and telegraph companies to pay an annual license tax upon their respective gross receipts.

The only question to be decided by the United States Supreme Court is as to whether the initiative and referendum amendments to the Oregon Constitution and state initiative law are valid, the company contending that they violate the Federal constitution and acts of Congress, particularly the act admitting Oregon into the Union.
