Easy Way to Dehorn Calves.

When the calf is two or three days old examine its head and as soon as the horns can be detected cause they believe they can play proceed as follows: Rub a little on the sympathy of the governor lard or other grease into the hair if they are convicted. Most of them around the horn. Have ready a can of concentrated lye that has been opened long enough to become softened by absorbing moisture ment, most of them will take a bigfrom the air, roll a bit of muslin ger chance than they would under into a roll the size of a lead pencil, dip the end of it into the softened lye and rub the top of the starting horn until the skin looks red. A couple of days later examine the horns. If a scab has formed over the top of the horn the job is successful ; if there is not a good scab, repeat the operation. One application is usually sufficient. This method is easy and safe, avoids the unpleasant task of cutting and
