CIRCUIT COURT DOCKET.

Court Convenes Monday With 60 Cases to Be Disposed of.

Circuit Judge Percy R. Kelly will convene the November term of the circuit court on Monday, although tomorrow (Friday) he will open court to hear motions and demurrers. There are 60 cases on the docket which include eight divorce cases. The most important case is that which is brought against the Port of Tillamook, as it attacks the constitutionality of that law and brings into question whether the original Port law is still in existence and whether the present Port is legally elected. Attorney Ralph R. Dunaway has been retained by the farmers of the county to fight this case, who is now in Washington, D. C., and it is doubtful whether he will return in time to argue this case. Attorney H. T. Botts will look after the Port's interest and will push the case to a hearing. There will be a grand jury draw and it may be that those who have been publishing and making insinuations about the County Court will be given an opportunity to substantiate their assertions before this inquisitorial body. Owing to Judge Kelly disposing of motions and demurrers before court convenes, this will mean that jury cases will be ready for trial Monday morning, which will shorten the time of the jurymen attending court.
