

Editorial Snap Shots.

Rah! Rah! Rah! Train service to-morrow. Now watch Tillamook grow and watch Tillamook grow.

County Commissioner Alley is in favor of a 10 mill road tax. Bully for Alley and rah! rah! rah! for good roads.

It may not be very consoling to the taxpayers, but they need more money at Salem to run the State government, consequently the State tax will be higher next year.

We have no doubt whatever that all reasonable, fair-minded persons in the county will come to the conclusion that \$150,000 expended annually on the roads in this county is little enough.

The booster editors are trying to secure good roads for the farmers and at the same time put a lot of good money into their pockets. It looks to us that the booster editors are the best friends the farmers have.

We cannot see how anyone who signed the petition to have road work stopped next year can have the gall to ask for road improvements or ask for road work. Give them a taste of their own medicine and give the road work to those who advocate good roads.

The County Court was, no doubt, prompted by the best intentions in refusing to grant a saloon license for Garibaldi, but should an appeal be taken to the circuit court it would not surprise us much if the circuit court would have to reverse the decision. Further than this we do not intend to discuss the decision, but it does appear to us, if we are correctly informed, that something should be done to control the liquor traffic at Garibaldi and stop the bootlegging.

Someone is boosting Theo. Roosevelt for president, for cards with this monogram, "3-T-C" (Third Term Club) are being mailed. Is this another political trick of Senator Bourne and the cause of him being booted out of the La Follette camp? It must be someone with plenty of money to spare and a political axe to grind who is sending out these cards. But, what's the good, President Taft will be re-nominated and re-elected because he is one of the most level headed men who filled the position of president.

It is about time that the City Council was doing something with the dirty muss at the railroad crossing near the saw mill, for it is in a disgraceful condition. Someone needs jacking up, Mr. Mayor, for there is a city council, a street committee, a street commissioner, and a civic improvement committee, whose duty it is to look after such nuisances and inconvenience to pedestrians. If the Mayor can't get either of these city dignitaries to do something we'll have to pitch in and give them some hot shots.

Circuit Judge Percy R. Kelly will make his first appearance on the bench in this county to-morrow (Friday), and with it comes a long needed improvement in court proceedings here. Instead of jurymen having to hang around while attorneys are arguing motions and other technicalities, the judge will dispose of this by coming here two days previous to the date of holding court, so that when court convenes on Monday it will be able to get down to business right away, and it will save the county money in not having to pay a whole raft of jurymen while attorneys are getting through their preliminary methods.

Because the Jackson County Court is paying a road engineer a salary of \$5,000 a year several farmers of that county are petitioning that his salary be stopped during the winter months. With \$1,500,000 in a bond issue to expend on roads, the engineer will have plenty of work in preparing plans and specifications so as to provide against wasteful methods. It takes a long time to educate some people, even to the correct methods of road buildings. Any kind of a grade and drainage and any old kind of rock, will never make good roads. It is the proper

planning out, and above all, the proper kind of rock, which will make the best roads.

One necessary step in the improvement of the Necarney mountain road is nearly complete, viz., that of surveying the road and preparing plans and specification. Although no figures are compiled yet, it is safe to make a guess that the cost will total somewhere near \$35,000. Considering that it will give Tillamook County one of the most scenic roads in the Northwest, the cost is a mere bagatelle to the reputation the county will obtain and the thousands of visitors it will bring into the county. Let everybody take pride in beautifying the splendid scenic spots in Tillamook County, no matter where they are situated. The next step, and the most perplexing, is how to provide money to build the road. We hope some plan can be arranged whereby the money will be forthcoming.

Tillamook County will have a visitor next week who is one of the members of the Rivers and Harbor Committee—Representative Humphrey, of Washington—provided trains are running. Representative Hawley arranged this meeting with the committee and Mr. Humphrey was appointed to accompany him when he came to Tillamook this fall to go over the situation and confer with the different Ports. That some good results will be the outcome of this visit we feel sure will follow if some united action of the Ports had been agreed up, for nothing can be accomplished if one Port is persistent in wanting one thing and another Port equally persistent in demanding something else. The three Ports should get together and agree on one project and then get as much government aid as possible.

We are sorry to see the Bay City newspaper is so persistent in its "knocking." Cut it out Bro. Trombley, for it is not adding reputation to the city on the bay to keep throwing unjust insinuations at the County Court and giving Bayocean an occasional stab in the back. We know that it is the desire of the Press of the county to help boost every section of Tillamook County, and that is the spirit that should continue to exist if the newspapers expect to accomplish anything by united effort. There is a bright future for every section of the county, and what can be done in obtaining good roads and other improvements helps to one great object—the building up and the development of the county. The snap shot man is a booster for the entire county, and we hope that Bro. Trombley will take a broader view in future and get back into the boosters' band wagon, for that is where he and the Bay City newspaper belongs—not classed amongst those who are wanting to keep the county bottled up.

Something like \$100,000 is needed to improve roads to the numerous beach resorts, and that amount of money could be expended next year for that purpose to good advantage. We hope this statement will not raise the wool on the craniums of our reactionary friends or cause an explosion in the camp of those who want road work shut down. Let the snap shot man show where it is a business investment. The rapid improvement the next few years is going to increase the assessed valuation of the county several million dollars, and by giving all beach resorts good roads it will induce more people to come to the county and invest in summer homes, for we expect to see Tillamook County the center of the summer travel. We are opposed to any policy that will retard this development of the county, and where roads will help to increase the assessed valuation of the county, they should be built with as little delay as possible. We wish the County Court would raise \$250,000 next year instead of \$150,000, and if put up to a vote of the people, with an assurance that each road district would get an equal share of the money, we believe the sovereign will of the people would carry it through with a whoop.

Close observers of current events must admit that the political nostrums which filled the peoples' minds in recent elections are not what they were cracked up to be. For instance,

some of the farmers in South Prairie and Fairview precincts are paying a Portland attorney \$500 to defeat the sovereign will of the people when, under the Oregon system, the people legislated to create a Port of Tillamook. Carnahan, another hot bed precinct of the Oregon system, voted almost solid against creating a Port of Bayocean, was roped in by the sovereign will of the people. These three precincts, with several others in the county, wanted the Oregon system and the sovereign will of the people to rule and legislate, having the first taste of what they wanted, should take their own medicine. It was what they howled for and obtained. We do not want to taunt our political friends who were led astray, but we look for the system to work considerable hardship on the people even though it is the sovereign will of the people. However, it was the sovereign will of the people which created the Ports of Tillamook, Bay City and Bayocean, and those who are so fond of the Oregon system and commence fighting it whenever it is invoked are in a queer dilemma. We move that they pass around the hat for another \$500 for Attorney Duniway to fight the system.

High School Flashes.

According to arrangements made by the manager of the foot ball team, the High School will play a game of foot ball with the Hillsboro High School team on Saturday, November 25th at the Gilford Stillwell Park. The home team has been doing hard practice work lately and from all appearances we would judge that they will play a good game. As this will be the first inter-scholastic foot ball game ever played in this county and as it is also the first time that the home team has ever met an outside team in such an event, it is expected of all those who can spare the time, to attend the game.

Tests are being dealt out in rather unknown quantities and at rather unthought of times. However the plan works well in finding out how much the students keep their work in mind. The Emersonian program will be the thing of all importance next Friday afternoon. We feel after reading the list of parts on their poster that without a doubt it will be the best program of the year thus far and if pulled off right will be something that will not likely be surpassed this year. Their poster is of very unique design, it being a large turkey painted on rough finish dickered edge card board. It will undoubtedly secure a good grade for them.

The Ciceronian poster is already on the bulletin board and the students as they pass by, stop to gaze at the painting of a colonial flag which would look very well were it not for the fact that it is rather poorly proportioned.

The Student Body Court met Friday evening to act on the case of Student Body vs. "Breakers," a Fraternity. A great deal of general excitement in the school seems to be one result of this trial although it is unnecessary to relate any of the particulars of the case at this time. However, it may be well to state that the court decided that

the society was secret and as their own testimony were to the effect that all their members were High School boys, it could only be considered an unlawful institution. The members of the institution were dissatisfied with the decision of the court so the case was referred to the Board of Directors who sustained the decision and ordered the club to comply with the law.

City Council Meeting.

On Monday evening the city council met in regular session and after allowing the regular bills, passed three ordinances, the same to be voted on as amendments to the city charter, at the regular city election on Monday, Dec. 4th.

Ordinance number 216 and 217 go together, but cover different phases of the subject of making the offices of Recorder and marshal, appointive by the mayor, and retain office during his pleasure instead of being elected by the people.

Ordinance number 218, simply takes from the charter a provision that is of no effect. The charter now states that the Recorder shall act as assessor, when in fact that power was taken from the Recorder some years ago by legislative action.

Ordinance number 223 changes the charter so that the limit of indebtedness can be extended from its present limit of \$60,000 to \$150,000. This does not mean that the city officials can without further action on the part of the voters run the city in debt to the amount of \$150,000. The adoption of Ordinance number 223, simply means that the city can go in debt to the amount of \$150,000 and no further, after ordinance number 223 is accepted by the voters, should the people wish to incur an indebtedness for the construction of sewer mains or for any other improvements, each appropriation will have to be voted on separately at special elections.

It is positively necessary that ordinance No. 223 be accepted by the people before any action in the line of sewer improvements can be undertaken.
