This has caused the writer to note and reflect considerable on the inequal ity of the distribution of these funds and led him to question the wisdom of she policy of spending enormous sum of money on favored portions of the community while other portions are en tirely neglected.

While this may on the surface appear to be founded on the old saw: "the greatest good to the greatest number" yet after all. will not the greatest god eventually come from the treatment of each and all of the members of the whole community with SOME consideration?

There is nothing calculated to build up a community faster th n to develop its resources. A number of beautiful rich valleys with thousands of acres of productive soil in our own county are producing comparatively nothing be cause men with families will not more into a neighborhood that will shut them up like a rat in a trap.

These acres could and would, if the proper inducments were offered, be teeming with inhabitants, who like busy bees would send products to market that would bring a large increase to the public exchequer and contribute much to the welfare of the people.
