Addison Bennett Deplores Lack of Interest Shown Great Industry's Exhibit.

BY ADDISON BENNETT, IN THE OREGONIAN. The Oregon Butter & Cheese Makers' Association was in session yesterday at the Woodmen of the World Hall, on Eleventh street, and the meeting was interesting but poorly attended, there being no auditors worth mentioning aside from the members of the association.

A more wide-awake and intelligent set of men are seldom seen deliberating in this section, and the lack of outside interest bothered them not at all. They attended to the routine business, listened to the papers read, followed closely the later discussions, were interested and interesting every moment. It was business not play, with them. They were intent upon bettering the conditions of every butter and cheese-maker from Tillamook to Ontario, from the Columbia to Goose Lake.

Big Exhibit Made.

In the basement under the hail there was a large exhibit of butter and cheese, and all sorts of dairy equipments and machinery, from the great cheese vat to the separator, from antiseptic boots to a germ-proof thermometer. The butter and cheese was scored by judges, for many valuable prizes are to be distributed for the best of these products, and the competition was keen, these prizes meaning a great deal to those who capture them. Just how butter is scored, I do not know; but I can remember of occasionally during my life going against butter that ought not only to have been scored, but exoriated. Then every hair ought to have been pulled out of it, it should have been compelled to join hands with its near relative, Mr. Axle Grease, and march away to oblivion.

The butter on view yesterday was as fine as any ever made anywhere. It is a truth that the people of Oregon have at their command as good butter as there is in the world—so long as the home product holds out. But we ship in a carload a week from the East, and some of that will tell you, for much of it is able to speak for itself, that it is pretty rank.

Think of Oregon people sending away every year for \$200,000 worth of butter! Is it not a shame? Then remember that there are some of our dealers (not many, but a few,) who are contemptible enough to take this foreign product and place it in Oregon wrappers and sell it as choice Oregon butter.

Tillamook Rules Field.

It is such things as that that make the Oregon butter and cheese-makers hot under the collar. There will be a stop put to the nefarious practice, and the association will be a big factor in bringing about the reform.

Cheese! How is it that Tillamook County produces about all the cheese made in Oregon? Is its land, its water or its climate better than can be found elsewhere in the state? Or is it the splendid co-operation that prevails there among the cheese-makers?

Now, I would not for the world belittle the natural advantages the Tillamook people have; but how about portions of Clatsop, Lincoln, Lane, Coos and Curry counties? Cannot just as good cheese be made in those, and other sections, as can be made in Tillamook? I will not answer that question, because I do not wish to detract one tittle from the reputation the Tillamook people have earned and established, not a fraction of a tittle—which I can safely say, having never met up with a tittle.

Look at the organization of the Tillamook creameries and cheese-makers, every concern in the county is banded together under the name of the Tillamook County Creamery Association, and they work as one, as a unit. They employ but one selling agent, make no cuts in prices, keep their products up to the highest standard work-together with the precision of a well-oiled machine and with the combined intelligence of the best and brainiest men of their number.
