



Advantages of a Checking Account

II. Checks as Receipts.

Before cashing a check, payee must sign his name on back in acknowledgment of receipt of the money.

All checks which depositor issues are returned to him after being cashed by the bank.

These checks constitute a valid receipt for the moneys paid, and safeguard the depositor against claims for duplicate payments.

Checking accounts are always welcome at this bank, subject only to reasonable restriction as to minimum average balances.

He left on Tuesday, and will give an invitation to the G. R. A. to hold their Encampment in Tillamook next year. Mr. Cooper expects to have many novel features for the celebration, such as a dairy maid's drill, decorated auto parade, an electrical display, etc.

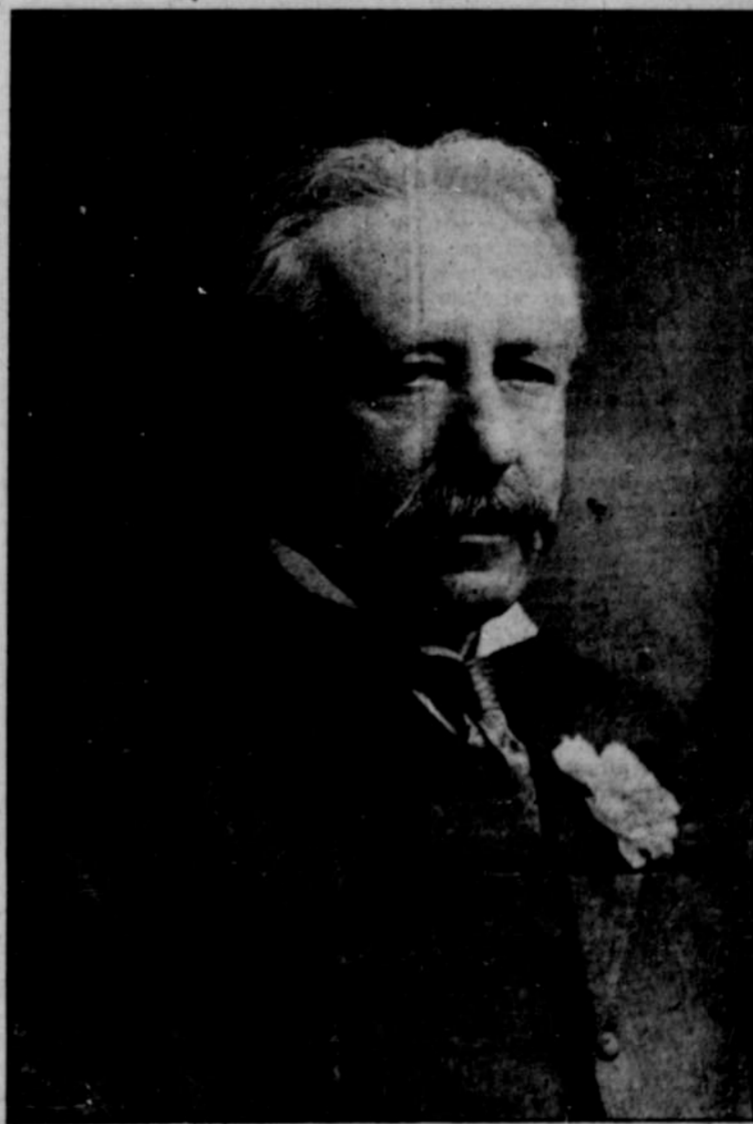

TO SPEND \$180,890.40 FOR CIVIC IMPROVEMENTS.

Warren Construction Co. Secures Contract for Pavement and Sewer.

At a meeting of the City Council on Wednesday evening, when Mayor Harter and Councilmen Sappington, Leach, Maddux, Vantress and Knudson were present, quite a number of contractors and citizens were present, as this was the time when the sewer and paving bids were to be opened. The bids were:

The council went into executive session to consider the bids, after which the contracts were awarded to the Warren Construction Company, which will mean an expenditure of \$180,890.40 for civic improvements and will give the city about 60 blocks paved with the celebrated bitulithic pavement. Work will have to commence three days after the contract is signed, but it is the intention of the Warren Construction Company to push the work as rapidly as possible, as the street pavement cannot be done after the rainy season sets in.
