The Tillamook County official


made no promises when this road would be completed, but will take it into consideration later, and it is probable that if Clatsop County will agree to build their part of the inner road, that this county will complete the Necarney mountain appropriating a certain amount for the next two years so as to have it finished when the Columbia Highway is finished. In looking over some of the roads in Clatsop Countp they found quite a number of narrow roads, the Tillamook County officials contending that it is more economical to build the wide road as is prevalent in this county to narrow ones.
