Trickery of Port of Bay City in Annexing New Territory.

Another petition has been filed with the County Court to annex more territory to the Port of Bay City. The new petition embraces all the territory left out of the previous petitions (outside of the territory embraced in the original the Tillamook W.C.T.U. heartily Port of Tillamook, which take in approve of the course Governor Tillamook City and fifty feet on West is pursuing, and either side of Hoquarton slough to Drystocking bar) that was included and and had not been petitioned for or annex which belonged to the Port of Tillamook). Consequently there are two petitions and there will have to be two elections and two ballots to annex territory which is adjoining. There is trickery in the whole scheme, as the boundaries of the two petitions plainly show, for one petition embraces and circles round land where there are no residents, and the other petition is to annex the territory where there are settlers. If the Port of Bay City wanted to act square and white with the citizens of this county, it would and should have, included all the land in one petition, as it all adjoins. The County Court has ordered a special election for November 30th on both of these petitions. Following is the territory embraced in the last petition :
