will take from the minority the abused power to initiate and pass laws that only a small percentage of the people understand, and confirms the majority its rights to rule.

Has it not been the purpose of the initiative to give the people the majority—the right to rule? How can the majority rule 25 or 30 per cent of the voters are allowed to enact laws?

Look at it this way and you will see the danger in the law which proposed amendment will remedy! A certain clique, or certain interests, desire a law or laws passed; they send out an army of paid canvassers to solicit names for the petitions so much per name, the petition is filed and the measure goes on the ballot; those who have initiated the measure and those who signed the petitions—a small per cent of the electorate—vote for it, a few people who know that the proposed law is aimed at the rights of the people vote against it; but the majority who read in one paper that the law is a good one and who

read in another paper that it is a bad law, frankly admit that they do not understand it, and refrain from voting. What is the result? The people who have initiated and who are deeply interested in the measure—a small minority, about 25 or 30 per cent of the electorate—are counted for it, as are those who did not vote on it at all and it is declared passed.

That is what has happened in the past and what will happen at the coming election. That is Minority Rule, not Majority Rule.

The proposed amendment will safeguard the rights of the people and make the rule of the majority, majority rule indeed, and not minority rule as at present.

Is it right that our state constitution should work so that conditions could possibly arise when less than a majority of the voters cast at an election could amend the Constitution?

Is it not evident that this is the weak spot in our initiative law? Is it not true that all are affected by the passage of bad laws as well as good laws? Is it not true that all must pay the cost of such legislation?

Is it better to have the approval of a majority of the total number of votes cast at any election than to pass any law without it?

If you will carefully consider the merits of the Majority Rule amendment you will vote so that in the future the voters of Oregon will take more interest in legislation, for it will have a tendency to restrain experimenters causing less untried and experimental measures being proposed, thus giving the voter more time for the consideration of important measures.

By voting for the Majority Rule amendment you will correct the abusive use of the initiative law, and thereby preserve it in the State Constitution.

You, Mr. Voter, are to decide this very important question, and in order to decide it right you should vote 322 X Yes on November 5.

**Woman Suffrage.**

(TO THE EDITOR TILLAMOOK HEADLIGHT.)

In the issue of the Headlight, of October 17th, there was an article by the Oregon State Association opposed to the extension of the suffrage to women. I am very sorry there are such associations, for they are endeavoring to block, what I sincerely believe would be a great public good.

The writer says, the majority of women are opposed to equal suffrage. I admit that there are a large number among the society women who are opposed to the extension of woman's suffrage. They have perhaps never thought the matter over in its true light. They are the wives and daughters of millionaires, who are satisfied with prevailing conditions, and do not wish them changed.

The main point in their opposition, is that they do not care for equal suffrage because they do not wish to shoulder the responsibilities of a political campaign. The right of franchise cannot change conditions for them, as a man was never forced into a political campaign, why should a woman be? The active woman will gladly shoulder these responsibilities, if responsibilities there are, and the fashionable woman need have no fear there will be any responsibilities thrust upon her that she does not wish.

Because a majority of the society women, for they are chiefly the ones opposed, do not care for equal suffrage, seems to me a poor excuse to withhold it.

I do not think they realize the extent of the selfishness of their course, for selfish it is and when any public officer or private individual vacillates for his or her own interest, with no thought of the benefit to others their course is usually a failure. I mean nothing against these excellent women, for I think they are such. They only judge from their own conditions, and do not realize they are hindering a great good, which sooner or later must be.

The writer speaks of a great many men being indifferent. Right here I wish to say, why not let the active women take the place of the indifferent men? Our country needs more energetic workers and if they can't be found among the men, there are women more than willing to do their part.

The writer does well to speak of the indifferent woman. That is a point I wish especially to express. Why are some women indifferent? That is a question which is easily answered. The majority of states of the union bar women from public functions, and she grows up with one vague idea of politics. Our boys are early taught to study politics, so as to be able to vote, intelligently, in the right way, when the proper time come. While the girl, no matter how keen a perception she is gifted with, no matter how great an intellect, what good does it do if she has an opinion on political affairs; she hasn't a voice in the making of the laws she must obey. Is it any wonder she is indifferent? Let her once have a voice in the affairs of the nation, and she is indifferent no longer. She is then one of the people of the nation; and while she is still a woman at heart in her domestic affairs, she will then have the right to use her intellect, and help her brothers, in bettering the conditions of the nation.

It appears to me unjust, that we should have to ask for what should be our right—nay, not only ask, but beseech it. The American men are noted for their chivalry to women, why not grant us this privilege.

In conclusion, I wish to say to the voters of this county, and the State of Oregon in general, that while the fashionable women of the state are opposed to equal suffrage for the reason that they have nothing more to wish for in this respect, the working woman, the business woman, the thinking woman, are working zealously for what should be generously given her. Please give this matter your earnest consideration, and vote yes for women's suffrage.

**High School Notes.**

Football relations with Hillsboro High have been cancelled by the fact that several of their players are unable to play, on account of injuries and parental objections, as was stated in a letter received from Hillsboro by Manager Stam. This fact has caused a "down heartedness" feeling among the T. H. S. athletes, for they have been looking forward to the games with H. H. S. as an important pleasure. These games were the only ones upon T. H. S.'s schedule, so it is manifest that Tillamook will have no inter-scholastic games of football, unless further arrangements are made with some other school which is not probable, as all other schools of any football importance have, beyond a doubt, filled their schedules long before this time.

The Boys' Athletic Association met on Monday and decided to quit interscholastic football for this year on account of the above mentioned reasons, but an inter-society game will probably be held on Election Day, in which all boys or men who ever were members of either society, will be invited to try for the team of the society of which they were once a member. This promises to be an interesting and hard fought game as both organizations have very strong players both in and out of school.

Arrangements are on foot for a game to be played between T. H. S. and Tillamook City teams on Thanksgiving, but whether or not this proposition will be successful is as yet to be determined as several of the High School fellows have become disinterested in football, owing to the cancellation of the Hillsboro games.

Although the Girls' Athletic Association has the best part of the old school building for a gymnasium, the boys will have a place to play in which to play in the near future, and one that will make the girls' gym look like a "hen coop."

Benley Stam was elected as General Manager of Athletics at the same meeting and it was decided to correspond with outside schools and endeavor to secure a few games of basketball. Tillamook High School has a good quantity of material which only needs developing. Some of the most enthusiastic students are advocating the organization of a basket ball league in this county. If this organization is brought about there will probably be five or six teams to join the league.

The Freshman Class are contemplating the giving of a Halloween Party. It seems as though the girls are to take charge. Of course every one will have a good time, for who ever went to a Freshman party without having a good time.

Mr. Moore has decided that the Freshman Algebra Class was too large, therefore he has divided it into two sections; the A class and the B class. There are sixteen members in the A class and seventeen in the B class, making a total of thirty-three Freshman, the largest class ever enrolled in the first year of Tillamook High School.

The dramatically gifted students are practicing faithfully on "Uncle Rube" and will be ready to appear before the public with this four act drama-comedy in a short time.

Professor Baker announced on Monday that all High School boys seen smoking, or using tobacco in any form would be subject to suspension from school for an indefinite period. It has been discovered that High School boys smoking has influenced the boys of the lower grades to use tobacco also. This is the main reason given for the measure which has been taken. As yet no boys have been suspended, and it to be hoped that they will be sensible and stop the filthy habit.

Teachers' Annual Institute started on October 30th. E. F. Carlton, Assistant State Superintendent of Education, will take charge of the institute, and much good work is expected. Mr. Carlton was here last commencement and delivered the address to the graduating class of 1912. He proved to be a very intelligent and logical speaker. There will be three extra holidays this week for the students, owing to the Institute. This will give them a good chance to make up any work, in which possibly they have fallen behind.

The Ciceronian Literary Society gave their first program which is the first program of the year, on Tuesday, October 29th. The main feature was the initiation of new members. After they were lined up on the front of the stage they were each instructed to repeat a nursery rhyme which was done without much hesitancy.
