In the matter of the petition of T. E. Epplett and others for a county road, the same was ordered open and declared a public highway.

In the matter of the petition of Vincenz Jacob for refund of taxes, the same was rejected, and of C. M. Giddings, the sum of \$9.23 was ordered refunded; and of W. D. Rhodes, \$18.39 was ordered refunded.

1—DATES:
 (a) January 16-17, 1913.

2—PROGRAM:
 (a) Thursday—Physiology, Geography, History and Civil Government.
 (b) Friday—Grammar, Spelling, Arithmetic and Agriculture.

3—SOURCES OF QUESTIONS:
 (a) Agriculture—Stevens, Burkett & Hill.
 (b) Arithmetic—Practical Arithmetic, Smith, Follow outline as given in State Course of Study.

(c) Civil Government—United States Constitution. See Outline in State Course of Study.
 (d) Geography—State Course of Study; Redway and Hinman's Natural School Geography.

(e) History—Doubt, List of Topics from History Outline in State Course of Study and Current Events.

(f) Grammar—Buhler's Modern English Grammar, no diagramming. Follow Outline as given in State Course of Study.

(g) Physiology—Graded Lessons in Physiology and Hygiene, Krohn.

(h) Reading—The teacher will send to the County Superintendent the applicant's class standing in reading which will be taken by such superintendent as the applicant's standing in the subject.

(i) Spelling—Reed's Word Lessons.

(j) Writing—Specimens in penmanship as indicated by manuscript in Grammar.

Note.—The examination in Agriculture will not be given for the January Examination, but will be

included in the May Examination and all others thereafter. Teachers should forward names of pupils who are to write at least ten days before date of examination.
