### ELECTION NOTICE.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN,—That on the 14th day of January 1913, at the City Hall, in Tillamook City, in the County of Tillamook, State of Oregon, a Special Election will be held at which there will be submitted to the qualified electors of Tillamook City, Oregon, for their adoption or rejection, the following ordinance providing for an amendment of the City Charter of said Tillamook City, to-wit:

An ordinance for an amendment to the Charter of Tillamook City, making it unlawful to sell, exchange or give away intoxicating liquors in said city, and prescribing penalties for a violation thereof.

The People of Tillamook City Do Ordain as Follows:

Section 1. The Charter of Tillamook City is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

ARTICLE XII  
 Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation within the limits of Tillamook City, Oregon, at any time after April 1st, 1913, to sell, exchange, or give away any intoxicating liquors except as provided for in this Article, or to have in their possession any such liquors with the intent to sell, exchange or give away the same, in violation or evasion of the provisions of this Article.

Section 2. Section 1 of this Article shall not be so construed as to prohibit the sale of pure alcohol for scientific and medical purposes, or to churches, or for sacramental purposes, or alcoholic stimulants as medicine in cases of actual sickness, but such stimulants shall only be sold upon the written prescription of a regular practicing physician, dated and signed by him, and certified on his honor that he, the physician, has personally examined the applicant, naming him, and that he finds him actually sick and in need of the stimulant prescribed as medicine; provided, that a physician who does not follow the practice of medicine as a principal and usual calling shall not be authorized to give the prescription provided for in this section, and provided further that no person shall be permitted to sell more than once on the prescription nor shall any person be permitted to sell at all on the prescription of a physician not herein authorized to give it, nor on a prescription which is not dated, signed and certified as above required; provided, that every person selling such stimulants upon the prescription herein provided for shall cancel such prescription by endorsing thereon the word "cancelled" and the date of cancellation, and shall file the same away. Nothing in this act shall be construed to prevent one registered pharmacist selling such alcoholic liquors to another registered pharmacist.

Section 3. Any person, who shall, within Tillamook City, Oregon, after April 1st, 1913, sell, exchange or give away for the purpose of evading the provisions of this Article, any intoxicating liquors whatsoever, or in any way violate any of the provisions of this Article, shall be subject to prosecution therefor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$500, or by imprisonment in the city jail for not less than 10 days nor more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. If any person shall be convicted a second time for violating the provisions of this Article, such person shall be punished for such second, and

each subsequent, violation, by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. In all cases where any person, firm or an association of persons pursuing the occupation of liquor dealers under license issued in accordance with the ordinances of Tillamook City, shall be prevented from pursuing such occupation for the full time to which he would otherwise be entitled, by reason of the adoption of this Article, a proportionate amount of the license fee paid by him for the unexpired term shall be refunded by Tillamook City.

Section 5. It shall be the special duty of the City Attorney to file or have filed a complaint in the City Recorder's court against all houses and the keepers thereof, used for the sale, exchange or gift of any kind of intoxicating liquors in Tillamook City where local devices are resorted to, to prevent or avoid detection of the keeper thereof, and upon said complaint being so filed, describing the place where the device is kept, or suspected to be kept, and the name of the person violating this article, if known, the City Recorder shall issue a warrant commanding the City Marshal or any police officer of Tillamook City to search such place and if the law is being violated, to arrest the person or persons so violating the law, and it shall be the duty of the officer having obtained such warrant to demand admission into the house or place where such device is alleged to be kept, and upon admission being refused, said officer is hereby authorized and required to force open the same and arrest and hold for trial all such persons therein found violating any of the provisions of this Article, and to take into his possession and keep until the termination of the trial of any person so accused, any intoxicating liquors found in such house or place, and belonging to such person, and in the event of the conviction of the owner and keeper of such house or place of the violation of any of the provisions of this Article, the City Recorder shall enter further judgment ordering any such liquors owned by the person so convicted and so seized to be destroyed by the marshal or any other police officer of Tillamook City, and such judgment shall be a complete defense to any claims for damages or compensation for the destruction of such liquors.

Section 6. In all prosecutions for a violation of this Article it shall not be necessary to state the kind of liquor sold, nor describe the place where sold, nor to show the knowledge of the principal to convict for the acts of an agent or servant, and in all cases the persons to whom intoxicating liquors shall be sold in violation hereof shall be competent witnesses.

Section 7. The issuing of a license or internal revenue special tax stamp by the federal government to any person for the sale of intoxicating liquors shall be prima facie evidence that such person is selling, exchanging or giving away intoxicating liquors, and a certified copy of any such license, duly certified by the officer authorized to issue the same, shall be competent evidence upon any trial under the provisions of this Article, and the original of said license shall not be necessary to be offered.

Section 8. In all actions for violations of the provisions of this Article one-half of the money collected as fines shall be paid to the prosecuting witness who shall furnish the evidence upon which conviction is secured.

The number and form in which the ballot title thereof will be printed on the official ballot is as follows:

Which said election will be held between the hours of 8 o'clock in the forenoon and 6 o'clock in the afternoon of said day.

By order of the Common Council of Tillamook City, Oregon, and in pursuance of an ordinance of said Tillamook City, duly passed and approved by the Mayor of said Tillamook City, on January 9th, 1913, providing for the holding of said City Election on the date aforesaid and for the purposes aforesaid.
