WHEREAS the completion of the Panama Canal emphasizes the importance of the improvement of every harbor on our Coast line from the Northern boundary of the State of Culifornia to the Columbia River,

WFEREAS there are many bays along the Pacific Coast capable of becoming splendid harbors, particularly those of Tillamook Bay, Yaquina Bay, Coos Bay, and others, each of which with a comparatively small cost to the Federal Government could be made ports of entry for all Coast wise vessels as well as those of deeper draft, and

WHEREAS tributary to these harbors are millions of feet of lumber in our matchless forests as well as large sections of agricultural land capable of producing great harvests, to say nothing of the products of our mines and our streams, all of which must reach the markets of the world through these channels,

WHEREAS each of these harbors are now in direct rail communical tion with other parts of the world whereby a proper distribution of commerce and the assembling of the products may be maintained,

THEREFORE Be It Resolved that the Senate, the House concurring, memorialize our represeniatives in Washington and request them to carnestly urge Congress to improve these ports and water ways and secure necessary and ample appropriations for the immediate improvement of these harbors that will open them for at least all Coast wise vessels so that the products of our forests, our mines, and our soil may thereby reach the world's markets.

### FEAR OF WAR.

Fearful Financial Burden It Places Upon the Great Nations.

War debt began with the nineteenth century. Not until the establishment of constitutional government had nations any credit in the world of finance. The bond of a king was notoriously bad security.

Since 1800 the war debts of the nations have grown by leaps and bounds. That of Europe as a whole amounts to more than \$26,000,000,000 and interest at the rate of \$1,150,000,000 per year. All these "endless caravans of ciphers" represent sums which have never been paid, will never be paid, can never be paid, so long as the present system of national armament goes on.

At the present rate of expenditure the four countries of Germany, France. Great Britain and the United States will spend in the next forty years, the life of one generation, for the support of armies and navies an amount sufficient to build 20,000,000 country and village houses at an average cost of \$2,500 each.

#### The Cement Gun. There is a cement gun which is used

to apply a mortar covering to structur al steel work. A mixture of dry sand and cement is shot from a nozzle by compressed air. A second hose delivers to the same nozzle a supply of water under pressure, and the mixture of sand, cement and water is shot out with a velocity of about 350 feet per second. The nozzle is arranged to produce a thorough wetting of the mate rial. As the mixture strikes the surface to be covered the coarse sand grains rebound until the fine cement mortar, which adheres immediately, has formed a plastic base in which the coarse particles become embedded. A covering of any required thickness in then rapidly built up. One of these guns has been used on the Panama canal in covering the sides of the Culebra cut with cement to prevent the unstable earth from sliding into the canal.-
