RESOLUTION AND NOTICE OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE CERTAIN STREETS IN TILLAMOOK CITY, OREGON.

Thayer's addition to Tillamook. THIRD AVENUE EAST. The west side of Third Avenue East, from the south side of Front Street to the north side of Fifth Street. The east side of Third Avenue East, from the south side of Second Street to the north side of Fifth Street. FOURTH AVENUE EAST. The west side of Fourth Avenue East, from the south side of Second Street to the north side of Fourth Street. The east side of Fourth Avenue East, from the south side of First Street to the north side of Third Street. FIRST STREET. The south side of First Street, from the east side of Second Avenue East to the west side of Third Avenue East. SECOND STREET. The north side of Second Street, from the east side of Stillwell Avenue to the west side of Third Avenue East. The south side of Second Street, from the east side of Stillwell Avenue to the west side of Third Avenue East.
