

I, Geo. W. Blackwell, being first duly sworn, depose and say I am a resident and Tax payer of said County and State and an old hand at the business, that I am unmar-ried, and have no children living to .ny knowledge, and that I hereby release all my right, title and inter-est in and to a certain promissory note of an ancient date, given by one Minny V. Stillwell, and made payable to me, said note was for the sum of thirty (\$30) dollars, said note has this date been paid in full, and I hereby acknowledge the re-ceipt of said sum, and warn and abjure any son of a gun from ever trying to collect said note or any rtion thereof. unto set my hand and seal this 26th day of Oct., 1888, eleven days before States of America
