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#### Disappointments for Consumers.

A dispatch from Buenos Aires states that foreign capitalists, chiefly Americans engaged in trust operations, have practically cornered the beef and mutton supply of Argentina and are ready to turn to their own advantage any reduction that may be made by tariff revisers in duties on meats. These trust representatives are reported to be paying more for food animals on the hoof than recent prices for the dressed meats sent to England, and independent packers in Argentina find themselves in straits. If the removal of a duty were surely followed by a corresponding reduction of prices to consumers tariff problems would be simpler. But the man with the market basket knows that no such rule can be depended on. Sometimes the article put on the free list is advanced in price by various agencies between producers and consumers, and a home industry is injured without any decline in the cost of living.

It can be assumed that the meats of Australia will be marked up also if American tariff schedules are foreshadowed by the final approval of the bill as it passed the House. The great rivers reaching up from Argentina into the heart of South America have long given access to a great supply of cattle cheaper than that of the United States, but of a poorer quality. In these times dressed meats can be sent far on ships with facilities for refrigeration. Cattle also are transported readily on vessels equipped for the trade. But speculative monopolists are quicker to act than is a legislative body. They calculate the probable action of lawmakers and place themselves in advance at the points of trade advantage. This country once suspended the duty on coal without the slightest resulting gain to consumers. The present tariff admits hides free, but shoes are no lower. Coffee has long been on the free list and is a great deal higher than in former years. These are facts Congress should weigh with an open mind and with due concern for the whole people.

Secretary of the Interior Lane favors the government building and ownership of railroads of Alaska. Mr. Bryan once proposed a move of this kind in the country generally, but found no support in his or any other party.

#### The Sacredness of Marriage.

At the General Assembly of the Northern Presbyterian Church at Atlanta a resolution was passed declaring marriage to be a sacred institution and calling for more strict and uniform marriage and divorce laws. Every expression of this kind is helpful, yet it would seem that the marriage question might be made more a matter of church than it is. Some denominations have no disciplinary machinery, large latitude being allowed to individual ministers and churches. But there are ministerial associations and various organizations which might so strongly set their seal of condemnation on the performance of the marriage ceremony by a minister, save under proper conditions of caution, that it would amount in force almost to authority.

Those who have made a study of the divorce evil have learned that much of it is founded on the marriage evil. Too easy marriage leads to divorce. Elopements, dares, joy ride engagements, divorce marriages, too youthful marriages, are all fraught with the potency of divorce. It would seem that the best way for the church to emphasize the sacredness of marriage would be for its ministers to refuse to perform the ceremony in all such cases. A safe rule would be for a minister to refuse to perform the ceremony unless he knew personally at least one of the parties and was entirely satisfied all the conditions were proper and calculated to make the marriage a good one. Strict rules in this respect, recommendations and resolutions in such denomination as have no supervisory authority, and discipline in others—as there already is in some—would do much to impress the sacredness of the marriage ceremony when performed by a minister, and relieve this clergy of much of the responsibility they now bear for the light regard the public have as to its sacredness.

Of course, stricter marriage laws are needed. The clergy can not bring about the reform alone, so long as the land throngs with justices of the peace, mayors and judges who see nothing in the marriage beyond a legal form authorized by a license. Regulations requiring publicity and the lapse of time between the application for a license and its issuance are the first and most obvious legal steps, but

there are others of a restrictive nature which are likely gradually to be adopted. While this would not affect the sacredness of the ceremony it would prevent many hasty marriages. The sacredness of the marriage ceremony must be preserved and protected by the church itself, not by law.

#### Warrenite Being Laid At Vancouver.

The city council of Vancouver, Washington has just authorized the laying of five miles of Warrenite paving by the Warren Brothers Company.

Warrenite is a paving which is becoming more and more popular, especially for country roads. It is adapted to rough usage, yet is smooth and durable.

Good roads are becoming more and more a necessity in these days of progressive development. While the coming of the railroad for years caused road hauling to fall into disuse, the value of good roads is coming to be recognized to its full extent, especially now since the heavy motor truck is economizing road hauling and making Warrenite a distinct advantage to the public, generally.

In all probability the Japanese Government will be diplomatically insistent upon an early reply to its protest against the California alien land law. While that government, officially, is without reason for doubting the good faith and friendliness of the one at Washington, there are political reasons why it should press for some sort of understanding preliminary to an early opening of negotiations for the making of a new treaty. The present Japanese ministry is not very strongly entrenched in office. Its title might even be called precarious, under existing conditions in Japanese politics. If the state of the public mind in that country has not been exaggerated, there will come a demand for immediate action, or some promise of early action, as soon as the California law becomes effective, or perhaps as soon as it is signed by the governor.

Before Uncle Sam goes into railroad building in Alaska it would be well to push the improvement of rivers along which 95,000,000 people are living.
