### Compact with Criminals.

(From the Spectator.)

With profound regret the true friends of President Wilson and all honest lovers of this republic learn that he has given his approval to the sundry civil bill. The wicked measure, which is class legislation in favor of criminals, subversive of good government, and a complete reversal of the Democratic creed of Equal rights to all and special privileges to none, specifically states that no portion of the sum provided for prosecutions of violators of the Sherman anti-trust law shall be used in bringing to justice members of labor unions or of farmers' organizations.

Thus we have a Democratic Congress passing, and a Democratic President signing, a bill deliberately to exempt from prosecution and punishment for crimes a class whose atrocious misdeeds of murdering and dynamiting in the past three years shocked the country. It may be said here that the farmers' organizations made no demand for this vicious exemption in their favor; but the labor unions did, and it was at their behest, enforced by a powerful and unquestionably insidious lobby that the bill was passed, and at their instance, backed by cajoleries and threats, that the abominable bill was signed.

Imagine what would have been the President's course if another dishonest and subservient Congress had been insane enough to pass a bill specifically exempting from punishment the rich law-breakers of the country! Would we not have been treated to a spectacular exhibition of splendid indignation and to a veto message that in scourging phase would have driven the truckling, servile Congressmen into deserved and never-ending oblivion? Surely; surely. But when a bill, whose plain, unequivocal meaning is that the Congress of the United States tells the unions that they may commit without fear of interference the crimes described in the Sherman act, is presented to him for approval and signature, President Wilson signs it—and his hand is not paralyzed.

It may be well to read what President Wilson says of the bill which he signed and what President Taft said of the same bill, which he vetoed. Here is President Wilson's comment:

If I could have separated from

the rest of the bill the item which authorized the expenditure by the Department of Justice of a special sum of \$300,000 for the prosecution of violations of the anti-trust law, I would have vetoed that item, because it places on the expenditure a limitation which in my opinion is unjustifiable in character and principle.

This limitation of expenditure which is unjustifiable in character principle is the provision that declares no part of the appropriation shall be used for the prosecution of labor-union members guilty of such crimes as were proved against the McNamara and the other Indianapolis dynamiters and murderers. Here is what President Taft said when he vetoed the bill, identical in terms with that that President Wilson signed:

The proviso is subtly worded so as in a measure to conceal its full effect by providing that no part of the money appropriated shall be spent in the prosecution of any organization or individual "for entering into any combination or agreement 'having in view' the increasing of wages, shortening of hours, or bettering the condition of labor, . . . etc." So that any organization formed with the beneficent purpose described in the proviso might later engage in a conspiracy to destroy by force, violence, or unfair means any employer or employees who failed to conform with its requirements, and yet because of its originally avowed lawful purpose it would be exempt from prosecution so far as prosecution depended upon the moneys appropriated by this act, no matter how wicked, how cruel, how deliberate the acts of which it was guilty. So, too, by the following sentence in the act, such an organization would be protected from prosecution "for any act done in furtherance" of "the increasing of wages, shortening of hours, or bettering the condition of labor," not in itself unlawful. But under the law of criminal conspiracy may become lawful in themselves may become the weapons whereby an unlawful purpose is carried out and accomplished.

And for these reasons, President Taft refused to sign the bill.

The Spectator takes the liberty of thinking and saying that when Woodrow Wilson signed this bill—infamous warrant for outrage and murder, dishonorable contract between the government and vicious criminals, wicked class legislation that is subversive of the principle that is equal and exact justice to all of equal and exact justice to all men—something good and honest and noble departed from him forever—the better part of him—and left him a mere politician. And he knows it. And the people know it.

WHEREAS, said Tillamook Bay and its tributaries are frequented by salmon fish, and, for the purpose of protecting the same, the said State Board of Fish and Game Commissioners have decided to close a tributary of said Tillamook Bay, known as the Hoquarton Slough, and its tributaries above a point on said Hoquarton Slough, 47 deg. 31 minutes West 2,013.7 feet from the section corner common to Sections 23, 24, 25 and 26, of Township 1 South, Range 10 West, of the Willamette Meridian—this point on said Hoquarton Slough being more particularly designated by posts erected by the Master Fish Warden warning the public; and also another tributary of said Tillamook Bay, known as Miami River, above a point where the county wagon bridge crosses said Miami River just below the Pacific Railway & Navigation Company's railroad bridge crossing said Miami River, all being in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, to prevent fishing therein by any means whatever, except with hook and line, commonly called angling, for salmon fish, during the periods of time hereafter specified.

NOW, THEREFORE, NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by the State Board of Fish and Game Commissioners that said tributary of Tillamook Bay, known as Hoquarton Slough and its tributaries above a point on said Hoquarton Slough 47 deg. 31 minutes West 2,013.7 feet from the section corner common to Sections 23, 24, 25 and 26, of Township 1 South, Range 10 West, of the Willamette Meridian—this point on said Hoquarton Slough being more particularly designated by posts erected by the Master Fish Warden warning the public, are and each of them is hereby closed to fishing of any kind for salmon fish, except with hook and line, commonly called angling, from and after July 17, 1913, until on and after October 15, 1913; and that the tributary of said Tillamook Bay, known as Miami River, above a point where the county wagon bridge crosses said Miami River just below the Pacific Railway & Navigation Company's railroad bridge crossing said Miami River, is hereby closed to fishing of any kind for salmon fish, except with hook and line, commonly called angling, from and after July 17th, 1913, until said tributary is opened again to salmon fishing, as provided for under Sec-

tion 5316 of Lord's Oregon Laws; and it is and will be unlawful to fish for, or take, or catch any salmon fish by any means whatever, except with hook and line, commonly called angling, in any of said waters during the said periods of time above specified.

Any and all persons whomsoever so fishing in violation of this notice will be prosecuted as by law provided.
