Another protective measure gratory highway from north to south, where no shooting may be done at any time. This highway consists of the Mississippi River from Minneapolis to New Orleans, the Missouri from its mouth to Bismarck, and the Ohio from Cairo to Pittsburgh.

The protective feature of the federal law is made operative by prescribing a fine of \$100 or ninety days in jail, or both, for violation of any feature of the law or regulation, and the appropriation of Hereafter it will be a crime to kill \$10,000 to carry it out. 
