Synopsis of the Tariff Bill.

As passed by the Senate, the bill contained the principal House features, including free sugar and free raw wool, but revised most of the schedules still further downward. The average ad valorem rate now is about 26 per cent, a decrease of 28 per cent from present rates. They are nearly 4 per cent lower than the average in the House bill.

What The President Had to Say. The brief statement issued by President Wilson upon the passage of the tariff bill was as follows: "A fight for the people and for free business, which has lasted a long generation through, has at last been won handsomely and completely."
