IS 24 MILLS. County Court Reduced the Budget \$109,830 76.

The County Court, after wrestling with the budget for next year's ex penditures for several weeks, came to a final decision on Thursday, the result of which the budget now carries an expenditure of \$257,397,12. This is a reduction of \$109,830.66 in the first budget, and about \$13,000 lower than that agreed upon at the the taxpayers' meeting on Friday. This means a saving of \$79,898.00 to the timber owners, who pay 75 per cent of the taxes, and \$29,932.66 for all other classes of taxpayers which makes the county tax, outside of State tax, 21/2 mills lower.
