A SAD DEATH.

Former Tillamook Girl Com-mits Suicide when Reproved by Her Father.

Alesea, Ore., Dec. 8th -At seven-thirty o'clock this morning, her mother having just stepped outside for a minute, after writing the following note, Marvel Lowry, aged 15 years, took Carbohc acid and died at one o'clock the same afternoon. "Can't have privileges other girls have, so goodbye."

Contrary to expectations of morbid people in cases of this kind, there is no scandal in connection with this case. The girl had just been reproved by her father for having once or twice walked from the school house to the wagon that carries the children to and from school, with a boy school-mate. On account of her age, her father did not approve. The deplorable tragedy seems to have been caused by a misunderstanding, her father having spoken to her in kindness and meant it for her good. No one can be blamed, as parents must reprove their children and must use their own judgment.

The writer has known the family for a number of years and know as her teacher and school mistress know, that her life was clean and she was loved by all.

She was a bright girl, having graduated from the eighth grade last June and entered high school in September.

Little Marvel was the idol of her parent's hearts and looked up to as a shining example by her brothers and sisters.
