THE PRIMARY IN TILLAMOOK

Political Parties Nominate Their Tickets.

The primary election in Tillamool passed off quietly on Friday, with little or no friction between the different aspirants for office. Considerable interest was taken in the state ticket of the Republican and Democratic parties on account of the large number of aspirants. Amongst local candidates there was a lively contest for county commissioners, county surveyor and sheriff on the Republican ticket. Frank L. Owens won out on the four-year term and F. L. Sappington on the two-year term, who was only 19 votes ahead of D. F. Thompson. Sappington had an overwhelming vote in three of the precincts of the North, Wheeler, Nehalem and Rockaway giving him 178 votes to 40 cast for Thompson. H. Crenshaw was an easy winner over Emmett Bales for sheriff. For county surveyor R. L. Shreve surprised himself and his friends by the manner in which he outdistanced his competitors. A. M. Hare, who is the nominee for county judge, polled more votes than any other candidate in the county, followed closely by J. C. Holden for county clerk. Following is the result of the pri-
