After months of parleying, the city council passed an ordinance on Monday night granting to F. D. Small and D. C. Urie a franchise to construct an electric light and power system in the city. The franchise requires the grantees to erect a water power plant at a cost of at least \$30,000 within 18 months after the date of the acceptance of the franchise. The council retains the right to make regulations of rates, subject to the general laws of the state, and to make other regulations as to the manner of operating the system. A bond of \$4,000 must be filed to guarantee that the plant will be ready to furnish light and power.

In the cases of the timber companies against Beall & Co., the Fort Dodge Machinery Co. and the county officials, Judge Holmes gave the plaintiffs permission to amend their complaints, after motion had been made by defendants to strike out part of the complaint. The case will be taken up again on Saturday. Attorneys S. S. Johnson and G. C. Fulton, of Astoria, are the attorneys for the timber companies; and attorneys A. C. Hammen and Hart, of Portland, represent the machinery companies; while the county's interest is being looked after by Attorney M. J. Gersoni.
