County Bank Installs Statement Machine.

Within the past few years banks the country over have been discarding the balancing of pass books, using them for recording deposits only, and are issuing statements. In accordance with this spirit of progress the Tillamook County Bank has installed a bank posting and statement machine, the very latest device for this work, and hereafter instead of bringing in the pass book to be balanced, each customer will get a neatly printed statement of his account when he wants it, without any delay, and regularly at times agreed upon between himself and the bank; either monthly or every two or three months as the activity of the account may require.

The ledger statement sheet is placed in the machine, the amount of checks subtracted from the balance of the day before and the deposit added, all automatically, and with the date automatically printed, a lever pulled, and the sheet is ejected from the machine with the amount of checks, deposit and new balance correctly printed. As no mental effort is required this saves much time and assures accuracy and neatness in posting.

This system puts the bank on a par with the best up-to-date city banks, enabling it to give as modern banking service to its patrons as they could get in the big cities.
