

COUNTY COURT NEWS.

County Court met in regular session on September 2nd, 1914, with the following officers present: Hon. Homer Mason, judge, presiding; H. M. Farmer, commissioner; F. L. Sappington, commissioner; J. C. Holden, Clerk, H. Crenshaw, Sheriff.

In the matter of an application of Chas. Ray for a franchise to maintain an electric light and water system in the village of Cloverdale and Park addition and all other public highways within one mile of the boundary lines of Cloverdale for a period of 30 years, the same is granted.

In the matter of the petition of the Garibaldi-Wheeler road, commencing at a point in T. 1 N. R. 10 W. of W. M., and paralleling the F. R. and N. Ry. to a point of termination in Sec. 2, T. 2 N. R. 10 West, it is ordered that U. G. Jackson, Fred Zaddach and W. Cain be appointed viewers, and that they shall meet at Nelson's store, Garibaldi at 10 a. m. September 14, or within 5 days thereafter, and view and lay out the proposed road.

In the matter of the petition of Joseph C. Smith and others for a county road from Neah-kah-nie Mountain to Manzanita Beach, board of viewers reports favorable. It is ordered that matter be referred to District Attorney.
